

1.1 Keys and connectors.....





Recent apps

· Tap to view applications you've recently accessed.

Home

- While on any application or screen, tap to return to the home screen.
- · Press and hold to open Google Assistant.

Back

• Tap to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialog box, options menu, the Notifications Panel, etc.

Power/Lock

- Press: Lock the screen or light up the screen.
- Press and hold: Show the popup menu to select from **Power off/Restart/Screenshot**.
- Press and hold the Power key for at least 8 seconds to force restart.
- Press and hold the Power key and Volume down key to capture a screenshot.

Volume up/down

- Adjust the earpiece or headset volume during a phone call
- Adjusts the media volume while listening to music or a video, or streaming content
- · Adjust the ringtone volume.
- Mute the ringtone of an incoming call.
- While using the Camera app, press Volume up or down key to take a photo or press and hold to take several photos.

1.2 Getting started.....

1.2.1 Setup

Inserting or removing the NANO SIM card/microSD[™] card



A **NANO SIM card** is required to make phone calls and use cellular networks. If you have a **NANO SIM card**, insert it before setting up the phone. Do not attempt to insert other SIM types like mini or micro SIM cards, as you may damage your phone.

Charging the battery

You are advised to fully charge the battery. Charging status is indicated by a percentage displayed on screen while the phone is powered off. The percentage increases as the phone is charged.



To reduce power consumption and energy waste, disconnect your charger when the battery is fully charged, and switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or apps running in the background when not needed. In Settings you can also lower the brightness of the screen, and shorten the length of time before the screen goes to sleep.

1.2.2 Power on your phone

To turn your phone on, hold down the **Power** key. It will take a few seconds before the screen lights up. If you've set a screen lock in Settings, enter your PIN, password, or swipe pattern to unlock your phone and display the Home screen.

If you do not know or have forgotten your unlock PIN/pattern, contact your service provider. Do not store your PIN or patern with your phone. Store this information in a safe place when not in use.

1.2.3 Power off your phone

To turn your phone off, hold down the **Power** key until the phone options appear, then select **Power off**.

1.3 Home screen.....

You can bring all your favorite icons (applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets) to your home screen for quick access. Tap the **Home** key to switch to home screen.

	 Favorite applications tray Tap to open the application. Press and hold to remove applications.

The home screen extends on the right side of the screen to allow more space for adding applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets. Slide the home screen horizontally right to get a complete view of the home screen. The white dot at the lower part of the screen indicates which screen you are viewing.

1.3.1 Using the touchscreen

Tap To access an application, tap it with your finger.

Press and hold

Press and hold the home screen to access WALLPAPERS/ SHORTCUTS screen.


Drag

Place your finger on any item to drag it to another location.


Slide/Swipe

Slide the screen to scroll up and down on applications, images, web pages, and more.

Pinch/Spread







Auto-rotate is disabled by default. To turn on auto-rotate, go to Settings > Display.

1.3.2 Status bar

From the status bar, you can view both phone status (on the right side) and notification information (on the left side).

Swipe down the status bar to view notifications and swipe down again to enter the Quick settings panel. Swipe up to close it.

Notification panel

Swipe down the Status bar to open the Notification panel to read the detailed information.



Tap on the notification to view it.

Tap **CLEAR ALL** to remove all event–based notifications (other ongoing notifications will remain)

Quick settings panel

Swipe down the Status bar twice to access the Quick Settings panel where you may enable or disable functions or change modes by tapping the icons.



Tap to access the full Settings menu, where you can manage other items.

1.3.3 Search bar

The device provides a Search function which can be used to locate information within applications, the device or the web.



Search by text

- Tap the Search bar from the home screen.
- Enter the text or phrase you want to find, then tap (3) on the keyboard to search.

Search by voice

- Tap I from Search bar to display a dialog screen.
- Say the text or phrase you want to find. A list of search results will display for you to select.

1.3.4 Lock/Unlock your screen

To protect your device and privacy, you can lock the device screen by choosing swipe or creating a password, PIN or unlock pattern.

To create a screen unlock pattern

 Swipe up on the home screen and select Settings, then tap Security & location > Screen lock > Pattern.

Tap Swipe, Pattern, PIN, or Password:

- Tap None to disable screen lock.
- Tap **Swipe** to enable screen lock. **NOTE:** you will not need a pattern, PIN, or password to access the phone
- Tap **Pattern** to create a pattern you must draw to unlock the screen.
- Tap PIN or Password to set a numeric PIN or an alphanumeric password that you must enter to unlock your screen.

To lock device screen

Press the **Power** key once to lock the screen.

To unlock device screen

- Press the **Power** key once to light up the screen.
- · Swipe up on the screen.
- If applicable, draw the unlock pattern or enter your PIN or password to unlock the screen.

Lock screen shortcuts (1)

- View notifications on your lock screen by double tapping the notification. Your device will then open that application with the notification.
- Access the applications Google Assistant, Messages, Camera, Flashlight or Settings by double tapping on the icons.

NOTE: Before opening the notification or application, your phone will prompt the unlock pattern/PIN/password, if enabled.



1.3.5 Personalize your Home screen

Add

To add an app to your home screen, swipe up on the home screen to access all the applications on the phone. Press and hold the desired app, and drag it to the home screen. To add an item to the extended home screen, drag and hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen.

To add a widget to your home screen, press and hold an empty place on the home screen, then tap Shortcuts.

Reposition

Press and hold the item, drag to the desired position, and then release. You can move items both on the home screen and the Favorite applications tray.

Remove

Press and hold the item you want to delete until **X Remove** appears at the top of the screen. Drag the item to **X Remove** and release your finger when the item turns red.

⁽¹⁾ Modify how notifications appear on your lock screen: Settings > Security & location > Lock screen preferences.

Create folders

To improve the organization of shortcuts and applications on the home screen, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another.

Wallpaper customization

Press and hold the empty area in the home screen, then tap **Wallpapers** to customize wallpaper.

1.3.6 Widgets and recently-used applications

View widgets

Press and hold the empty area in the home screen, then tap **Shortcuts** to display all widgets.

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Press}}$ and hold the selected widget and drag it to your preferred screen.

View recently-used applications

To view recently-used applications, tap the **Recent apps** key. Tap a thumbnail in the window to open the application. To close the recently-used application, slide the thumbnail right or left or tap \mathbf{X} .

1.3.7 Volume adjustment

Using volume key

Press Volume key, up or down, to open Volume quick settings and to adjust the volume.

Tap (i) to quickly change sound setting to Vibrate (i) or Silent . Tap Settings (i) to open the full Volume menu...

Using Settings menu

Swipe up on the Home screen to access the app tray, then tap **Settings** (2) > **Sound** to set volume of media, notification, and more.



2 Text input

2.1 Using onscreen keyboard.....

Onscreen Keyboard settings

From the home screen, swipe up to view app tray, and then tap Settings > System > Languages & input > Virtual keyboard, tap the keyboard you want to set up and a series of settings will become available.

2.2 Google keyboard.....



2.3 Text editing

- Press and hold or double-tap within the text you would like to edit.
- Drag the tabs to change the selection.
- The following options will show: Cut, Copy, Paste, Share.



• To exit from the selection and editing without making changes, tap an empty place in entry bar or words that haven't been selected.

You can also insert new text

- Tap where you want to type, or press and hold a blank space in the entry bar. The cursor will blink and the tab will show. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- If you have used Cut or Copy on any selected text, tap the tab to show Paste.



4 Phone and Contacts.....

4.1 Phone......

4.1.1 Making a call

Tap **Phone ()** on the home screen to access the **Phone** application. Slide left and right to access **Favorites**, **Recent Calls**, and **Contacts**. Tap **:** to view keypad for number search or entry.






- Open the keypad and dial the number to call, select a saved number from **Contacts**, or select a contact or number from **Recent**.
- Tap 💌 to delete any incorrect digits.
- Tap +2 Create new contact to save the dialed number to Contacts.
- Tap C to place the call.
- Tap ot to end a call.

International call

To dial an international call, press and hold to enter + then enter the international country prefix, followed by the full phone number, and tap **(**).

Emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial the emergency number and tap () to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without unlocking the phone. 4.1.2 Answering or rejecting a call



When you receive a call

- Tap 💽 or ANSWER to answer
- Tap or to reject
- Tap
 To reject the call and send a preset text message.
- Tap 💽 to set a reminder to return the call.

To mute the ringtone volume of an incoming call, press the **Volume up/down** key.

4.1.3 Calling your voicemail


Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time.

To access your voicemail, press and hold 1.

If you receive a voicemail, a voicemail icon OO appears on the Status bar. Open the Notification panel and tap New voicemail.

4.1.4 Using options during a call

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume up/ down key.





Tap to end the current call.



Tap to activate the speaker during the current call. Tap again to deactivate the speaker.



Tap to mute the current call. Tap again to unmute the call.

Tap to display the keypad.



Tap to place current call on hold. Tap again to resume the current call.

Tap to add a call.



To avoid accidental operation of the screen during a call, the screen will be locked automatically when you put the phone close to your ear; and it will be unlocked when the phone is taken away from your ear.

4.1.5 Managing multiple calls

With this phone you can handle multiple calls at the same time.

Swap calls

When you accept two calls, tap the \iint icon to switch between the two lines. The current call will be put on hold and you are able to join the other call.

Conference calls (1)

You can set up a conference call as follows.

- · Place a call to the first participant of the conference call.
- Tap 🛟 to add a call, then dial the number or choose from Contacts or Recent.
- Tap 🕓 to place the call.
- Tap ↑ to join the calls and start the conference.
- Tap o to end the conference call and disconnect all callers.

4.1.6 Adjusting your phone settings

Tap from the Phone screen, then tap **Settings**. The following options are available:

PHONE SETTINGS

Quick responses: Tap to edit quick responses which will be used when you reject a call with a text message.

Dial pad tones: Enable tones when using the dial pad.

Voicemail

Tap to access voicemail service and number settings.

Fixed Dialing Numbers

Fixed dialing numbers restrict outgoing calls to a set of phone numbers. These numbers are added to the FDN list. The most common practical application of FDN is for parents to restrict the phone numbers to which their children can dial. For security reasons, you'll be prompted to enable FDN by entering SIM PIN2 which is usually acquired from your service provider or SIM maker.

• Wi-Fi calling

Enable Wi-Fi calling to allow your device to make calls over a Wi-Fi network.

Call forwarding

Tap to configure how unanswered calls are forwarded.

Call barring

Tap to select calls to be barred, cancel call barring, or change barring password.

Additional settings

Tap to configure how your number displays for outgoing calls and your call waiting settings.

Accessibility

RTT Call Button

Real Time Text (RTT) assists callers who are deaf, hard of hearing, have a speech disability, or need more than voice alone. Incoming/outgoing speech can be converted to real-time text messaging when RTT call has been established.

• Hearing aids

Tap to enable hearing aid compatibility.

Noise reduction

Tap to enable reducted background noise during calls.

 $\ensuremath{\textbf{Quick}}$ dial: Assign phone numbers or contacts to keypad numbers for quick calling.

CONTACTS SETTINGS

Import/Export: Import or export contacts between phone, SIM card, microSD card and phone storage.

Merge contacts: Select duplicate contacts to merge.

Manage account: Manage the synchronization settings for different accounts.

Display options

Sort by

Set the contacts display by First name or Last name.

Name format


Set the name format by First name first or Last name first.

4.2 Contacts.....

 $\ensuremath{\textbf{Contacts}}$ enables quick and easy access to the people you want to reach.

You can view and create contacts on your device and synchronize these with your Gmail contacts or other applications.

4.2.1 Consult your contacts



Delete a contact

To delete a contact, tap and hold the icon on the left of contact you want to delete. When the icon changes to , tap and confirm to delete. Select multiple contacts to delete multiple contacts, or tap L to select all contacts, then tap and confirm to delete selected contacts.



Contacts deleted will also be removed from other applications on the phone or web the next time you synchronize your phone.

Tap the **Menu** icon **t** to display the contacts list option menu. **Group:** Tap to add and manage contact group.

Contacts to display: Choose contacts to display.

Settings

Tap to create my local profile.

Accounts

Tap to edit the users and accounts information.

Merge contacts

Tap to merge duplicate contacts.

Display options

Tap to select how contact names are sorted and displayed.

Import/Export

Import or export contacts between SIM card, microSDTM card and phone storage.

Blocked numbers


Tap to manage the blocked numbers. You won't receive calls or texts from blocked numbers.

Default account for new contacts

Tap to choose Phone or SIM card as default storage for new contacts.

4.2.2 Adding a contact

Tap in the contact list to create a new contact. Enter the contact's name and other contact information. By scrolling up and down the screen, you can move from one field to another easily.



When finished, tap 🗸 to save.

To exit without saving, tap **Back** and select **DISCARD**.

Add to/remove from Favorites

To add a contact to Favorites, tap a contact to view details then tap \bigstar (the star will turn \bigstar).

To remove a contact from favorites, tap \bigstar on contact details screen.

4.2.3 Editing your contacts

To edit contact information, tap on the contact to open contact details. Tap \checkmark on top of the screen. When finished editing, tap \checkmark to save the edits.

4.2.4 Communicating with your contacts

From the contacts list, you can communicate with your contacts by making a call or exchanging messages.

To place a call to a contact, tap the contact to enter the detail screen, then tap the number.

To send a message to a contact, tap the contact to enter the detail screen, then tap the \blacksquare icon on the right side of the number.

4.2.5 Contact importing, exporting and sharing

This device enables you to import or export contacts between phone storage, SIM card, and microSD^{\rm TM} card storage.

From the Contacts screen, tap the Menu icon to open the Settings menu. Tap **Import/Export**, then select the location to copy contacts from. Tap **NEXT**, then select the location to copy contacts to and tap **NEXT**.

To import/export a single contact from/to your SIM card, select the contact you want to import/export, and tap \checkmark to confirm.

Share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard via Bluetooth, Gmail, and more.

Tap a contact you want to share, tap from Contact details screen and select **Share**, then tap and select the application to perform this action.

4.2.6 Accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronized from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your device.

To add an account, swipe up on the home screen then Settings > Accounts > Add account.

Select the kind of account you are adding, such as Google. Enter the username and password, and follow the remaining prompts to continue setup.

You can remove an account to delete it and all associated information from the phone. Tap the account you want to delete, then tap **Remove Account** to remove it.

4.2.7 Turn on/off auto-sync

In the **Accounts** screen, turn on/off the **Automatically sync data** to activate/deactivate this function. When activated, all changes to information on the phone or online will be automatically synchronized with each other.

5 Messaging.....

Create, edit, send and receive text and mutimedia messages with Messaging.

Swipe up from the home screen and select Messaging 🔽 from the app tray.

5.2.1 Create a message

On the Messaging screen, tap new message 🔸 to create a new text or multimedia message.







For saved contacts, tap the photo to open the quick contact panel and access other ways to communicate with the contact. For unsaved contacts, tap the photo to add the number to your **Contacts**.

5.2.2 Sending a text message

Enter the mobile phone number of the recipient in the **To** bar or tap **+** to add recipients from Contacts. Tap the **Type message** bar to enter text. Tap $\textcircled{}{}$ to insert emoticons. When finished, tap $\overset{}{}_{aus}$ to send the text message.

An SMS message of more than 160 characters will be sent as several SMS. A character counter is displayed on the right of the text box.



Specific letters (accented) will also increase the size of the SMS, this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

5.2.3 Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations, slides and sounds to other compatible devices and e-mail addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, slides) are attached or email addresses are added.

To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number or email address in the **To** bar and tap the **Type message** bar to enter text. Tap to attach a picture, video, audio and more.

When finished, tap \geq to send the multimedia message.

5.2.4 Manage messages

When receiving a message, a message icon \blacksquare will appear on the status bar as a notification. Swipe down from the status bar to open the Notification panel, tap the new message to open and read it. You can also access the Messaging application and tap the message to open it.

Messages are displayed as conversations in the order received. Tap a message thread to open the conversation.

- Tap L to call the number
- Tap 🛓 to save the number to Contacts or view the contact details if the number has been saved
- To reply to a message, enter text in the Type message bar. Tap 🕑 to attach a media file. Tap 🕻 for more options.
- · Press and hold a message to access the following actions:
 - Copy text
 - Forward
 - View details (i)
 - Delete 💼
 - More options

5.2.5 Adjust message settings

You can adjust a range of message settings. From the Messaging application screen, tap \equiv and tap **Settings**. GENERAL

Add or edit message templates.

Delete old messages

Select to delete old messages when the maximum number of stored messages is reached.


6.1 Calendar.....




Use Calendar to keep track of important meetings, appointments, and more.

Multimode view

To change your Calendar view, tap \checkmark next to the month title to open the month view, or tap \equiv and select Schedule, Day, 3-Day, Week or Month to open different views. Tap \square ⁽¹⁾ to return to Today's view.





To create new events

- Tap + then select Event to access new event edit screen.
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can select ALL DAY.
- If applicable, enter the email addresses of the guests and separate with commas. All guests will receive an invitation from Calendar and Email.
- When finished, tap SAVE from the top of the screen.

To delete or edit an event

Tap an event to open details, then tap **‡** and then tap **Edit** to change the event or **Delete** to remove the event.

Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon will appear on Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Swipe down from the Status bar to open the notification panel, tap event name to view Calendar notification list.

Tap SNOOZE to turn off all event reminders for 10 minutes.

Tap the **Back** key to keep the reminders pending on the status bar and the notification panel.

6.2 Clock

Swipe up from the home screen and select $\ensuremath{\textbf{Clock}}$ from the app tray.

To adjust **Clock settings**, tap from the clock screen.

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Screen}}$ saver: Tap to access screen saver that displays the current time.

6.2.1 Alarm

To set an alarm

From the Clock screen, tap 🕜 to enter the Alarm screen, then tap 🔸 to add a new alarm. The following options will show:

• Time

Tap numbers to set the time for your alarm.

Repeat

Mark the checkbox of Repeat and then select the days you want your alarm to go off.

Ringtone

Select an alarm ringtone.

Vibrate

Mark the checkbox to activate/deactivate vibration.

Label

Set a name for the alarm.

Delete

Tap 🔟 to delete the alarm.

6.2.2 World clock


To view the world clock, tap () on the Clock screen. Tap \bigcirc to add a time zone from list.

6.2.3 Timer

From the **Clock** screen, tap \mathbf{X} to enter the **Timer** screen.

Tap the digits to set the countdown time. Type the time in hour, minute and second number sequence.

Tap 🕟 to start the countdown.



6.2.4 Stopwatch

From the **Clock** screen, tap <u>o</u> to enter the **Stopwatch** screen. Tap **o** to start the timer.

- · Tap LAP to save a lap time.
- Tap in to pause the stopwatch.
- Tap SHARE to share the time through Bluetooth, Gmail, and more.




To solve mathematical problems with **Calculator**, swipe up from the home screen, then tap **Calculator**.

There are two panels available: Basic calculation and Scientific calculation.

To switch between panels, select one of the following two ways:

- Swipe the basic calculation screen to the left to open the scientific calculation.
- Turn the device to the landscape mode from the basic calculation screen to open the scientific calculation. This option is only available if **Auto-rotate screen** is on ⁽¹⁾.

(1) To access Auto-rotate screen, swipe down twice from the home screen to access Quick Settings and tap , or go to Settings > Display > Advanced > Auto-rotate screen.



Enter the number(s) and arithmetic operation(s) to be performed. Tap DEL to delete digits one by one, or tap and hold DEL to delete all at once.

7 Getting connected.....

To connect to the internet with this device, you can use your cellular network or Wi-Fi, whichever is most convenient.

7.1 Connecting to the Internet.....

7.1.1 Cellular network

Your mobile data connection can be enabled/disabled manually. Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Network & internet > Cellular network** and enable/disable Mobile data.

To activate/deactivate data roaming

Connect/disconnect to a data service while roaming ⁽¹⁾.

Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Network & internet > Cellular network** and enable/disable International Data Roaming. When roaming is disabled, you can still perform data exchange via a Wi-Fi connection.

7.1.2 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi, you can connect to the Internet when your device is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on your device even without a SIM card inserted.

To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- Swipe up on the home screen, tap Settings > Network & internet > Wi-Fi.
- Wi-Fi is turned on by default_tap
 to turn off Wi-Fi. Available Wi-Fi networks are displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- Tap a Wi-Fi network to connect. If the network you select is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials. When finished, tap **CONNECT**.

⁽¹⁾ Additional rates may apply.

To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you may add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- Swipe up on the home screen, tap Settings > Network & internet > Wi-Fi > Add network +.
- Enter the network SSID and required network information.
- Tap CONNECT.

When successfully connected, your device will be connected automatically the next time you are within range of this network.

To forget a Wi-Fi network

Prevent automatic connections to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- In the Wi-Fi screen, press and hold the name of the saved network.
- Tap FORGET in the dialog box that opens.

7.2 Connecting with Bluetooth ⁽¹⁾.....

To turn on Bluetooth

To exchange data or connect with a Bluetooth device, you need to enable Bluetooth and pair your phone with the preferred device.

- 1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap Settings > Connected devices > Connection preferences > Bluetooth.
- Tap (to enable Bluetooth. Your device and other available devices will show on the screen once your Bluetooth is activated.
- 3. To make your phone more recognizable, tap **Device Name** to change your device name.
- $^{\left(\right) }$ You are recommended to use Bluetooth devices and accessories tested and proved compatible with your phone.

To exchange data/connect with a device

To exchange data with another device

- 1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Connected** devices > Connection preferences > Bluetooth.
- 2. Tap (to enable Bluetooth. Your device and other available devices will show on the screen once your Bluetooth is activated.
- 3. Tap on the name of the device to initiate pairing. Tap **Pair** to confirm.
- 4. If the pairing is successful, your phone will connect to the device.

To disconnect/unpair from a device

- 1. Tap 🏟 after the device name you want to upair.
- 2. Tap Forget to confirm.

7.3 Connecting to a computer.....

With a USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between microSD card/internal storage and computer.

To connect/disconnect your device to/from the computer:

- Use the USB cable that came with your device to connect the device to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.
- When transfer is complete, use the eject action on your computer to disconnect your device.

7.4 Sharing your cellular data connection

You can share your device's cellular data connection with other devices by turning your device into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot.

To share your device's data connection as a portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- Swipe up on the home screen, tap Settings (2) > Network & internet > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- Tap moto turn on/off your device's mobile hotspot.
- Follow the instructions on your device to share your device's
 internet connection with other devices.

7.5 Connecting to virtual private networks.....

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

To add a VPN

- Swipe up on the home screen, tap Settings (2) > Network & internet > Advanced > VPN and tap Add +.
- Follow the instructions from your network administrator to configure each component of the VPN settings.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set a lock screen pattern, PIN code or password for your device.

To connect/disconnect to/from a VPN

- Swipe up on the home screen, tap Settings > Network & internet > Advanced > VPN.
- Tap the VPN you want to connect with. Note: VPNs previously added are listed as options.
- · Enter any requested credentials and tap Connect.
- To disconnect from the VPN, tap on the connected VPN and then select Disconnect.

To edit/delete a VPN

- Swipe up on the home screen, tap Settings > Network & internet > Advanced > VPN.
- Tap \$\$\$ > Edit profile. When finished editing, tap Save.
- Tap ¹/₄ > Delete profile.

To access Camera . tap the icon in the Favorite apps trav. or swipe up on the home screen and tap Camera
from the app tray.



To take a photo

To take a video

Tap to the right of the **Shutter** button De to change the camera mode to video, then tap the **Record** button **a** to start video recording. You can also tap to the left of the Record button **OP** to take a picture during video recording.

Tap 🔟 to pause video recording and tap 💽 to continue. Tap to stop recording. The video will be automatically saved.

10.1 Play Store >

Serves as the official app store for the Android operating system, allowing users to browse and download applications and games. Applications are either free of charge or available for purchase.

In the Play Store, search for the app you need, download it and then follow the installation guide to install the app. You can also uninstall, update an app, and manage your downloads.

10.2 Chrome......

Using the Chrome browser you can enjoy surfing the Web. Your bookmarks, browsing history, and settings across all devices with the browser installed can be synchronized with your Google account.

To get onto the Web, go to the home screen and tap the Chrome () in the Favorites tray.

10.2.1 To go to a web page

On the Chrome browser screen, tap the URL box at the top, enter the address of the web page, then tap \bigcirc on Google keyboard to confirm.

10.3 Gmail......

As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. Gmail on your phone can be automatically synchronized with your Gmail account on the web. With this application, you can receive and send emails, manage emails by labels, archive emails, and more.

10.3.1 To open Gmail

To add an account

1. From the home screen, tap Google folder 🛟 > 💆

- 2. Select Take me to Gmail to setup an account, or select Add an email address + to setup a different email account
- 3. Enter account credentials and confirm email account settings. Tap **Next** to continue through setup process.
- 4. Tap **Finish** when setup is complete. To add additional accounts, repeat the above steps.

To create and send emails

- 1. Tap 🖉 from the Inbox screen.
- 2. Enter the recipient's email address in **To** field.
- 3. If necessary, tap Add Cc/Bcc \checkmark to copy or blind copy a recipient to the message.
- 4. Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- 5. Tap Ċ and select Attach file to add an attachment.
- 6. Tap > to send.

If you do not want to send the email right away, tap and then **Save draft** or tap the **Back** key to save a draft. To view the draft, tap your account name to display all labels, then select **Drafts**.

YouTube is an online video-sharing application where users can upload, view, and share videos. Available content includes video clips, TV clips, music videos, and other content such as video blogging, short original videos, and educational videos. It supports a streaming function that allows you to start watching videos almost as soon as they begin downloading from the Internet.

10.6 Play Music...... p

A music streaming service and online music locker operated by Google.

You can upload and listen to a large number of songs for free. In addition to offering music streaming for Internet-connected devices, the Google Play Music app allows music to be stored and listened to offline. Songs purchased through the Play Music are automatically added to the user's account.

A lighter, faster way to search, with search results optimized to save up to 40% of data. Easily access your favorite apps and websites, as well as images, videos and information on the things you care about.

Cellular Data

Tap to enable cellular data such as email, web browsing and push notifications over the cellular network.

International Data Roaming

App data usage

Tap to view the amount of data each app uses.

11.1.3 Data usage

View settings and usage related to your data. Select Data warning & limit > Set data limit and then type in the desired amount under Data limit to set cellular data limit. Your cellular data connection will be disabled when the specified limit is reached. You can also choose a data usage cycle to view the statistics and related applications of used data by your phone.



Data usage is measured by your phone and your provider may count differently. You can set conservative limit to control data usage.

11.1.4 Tethering & portable hotspot

This function allows you to share your phone's cellular data connection via USB or as a portable Wi-Fi access point (refer to "7.4 Sharing your cellular data connection").

11.1.5 Airplane mode

Tap the switch **m** to turn on **Airplane mode** to simultaneously disable all wireless connections including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and more

11.1.6 Wi-Fi calling

Turn on/off Wi-Fi calling to allow your device to make calls over a Wi-Fi network

11.1.7 VPN

A mobile virtual private network (mobile VPN or mVPN) provides mobile devices with access to network resources and software applications on their home network, when they connect via other wireless or wired networks. Mobile VPNs are used in environments where workers need to keep application sessions open at all times, throughout the working day, as the user connects via various wireless networks, encounters gaps in coverage, or suspends-and-resumes their devices to preserve battery life. A conventional VPN can't survive such events because the network tunnel is disrupted, causing applications to disconnect, time out, fail, or even the computing device itself to crash.

When this function is enabled, you can always keep a window in view by taping the **Recent apps** key and then the pin icon. In this case, the user cannot go to any other window or open any other app.

To stop pinning a window in view, long press both the **Back** and **Recent apps** key together, then entering your screen unlock password or drawing your unlock pattern.

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronized from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your phone.

You are required to select the kind of account you are adding, such as Google or corporate.

As with other account setup, enter detailed information, like username and password.

You can remove an account to delete it and all associated information from the phone. Tap the account you want to delete, tap **Remove account**, then confirm.

In the **Accounts** screen, tap the switch to activate **Automatically sync data**. When activated, all changes to information on the phone or online will be automatically synchronized with each other.

11.10 Accessibility.....

You use the Accessibility settings to configure any accessibility plug-ins you have installed on your device.

Turn on/off to show/hide the button.

Setup the font size of text on screen to Small, Default, Large and Largest.

Turn on/off to activate/deactivate zoom in/out function by triple-tapping the screen.

Turn on/off color correction.

The Gboard settings apply to the onscreen keyboard that is included with your phone. The correction and capitalization features affect only the English version of the keyboard.

11.12.2 Gestures

Activate jump to camera.

11.12.3 Date & time

Use Date & Time settings to customize your preferences for how date and time are displayed.

Automatic date & time

Choose network-provided time, GPS-provided time or off.

Set date

If Automatic date & time is disabled, manually set your phone's date.

Set time

If Automatic date & time is disabled, manually set your phone's time.

Automatic time zone

Tap the switch **(**) to turn on using network-provided time zone. Or tap again to disable it, and then you can set time zone manually in **Select time zone**.

Select time zone

If Automatic time zone is disabled, manually set your phone's time zone.

Automatic 24-hour format

Your phone's time display format is automatically determined by your location time zone. Enable Automatic 24-hour format to allow your phone to switch to 24-hour format when in a time zone that uses this time format.

Use 24-hour format

If Automatic 24-hour format is disabled, manually set your phone to always use 24-hour format or to not adjust when in a 24-hour format time zone.

11.12.4 Regulatory & Safety

Check regulatory and safety information, such as IMEI, CU reference, Bluetooth declaration ID, etc.

11.12.5 Backup

Turn on the switch to back up your device's settings and other application data to Google Servers, with your Google account. If you replace your device, the settings and data you've backed up are restored onto the new device for the first time you sign in with your Google account. If you mark this option, a wide variety of settings and data are backed up, including your Wi-Fi passwords, bookmarks, a list of the applications you've installed, the words you've added to the dictionary used by the onscreen keyboard, and most of the settings that you configure with the Settings application. If you unmark this option, you stop backing up your settings, and any existing backups are deleted from Google Servers.

11.12.6 Reset options

Device reset will erase all of your personal data from internal device storage, including information about your Google account, any other accounts, your system and application settings, and any downloaded applications. Resetting the device does not erase any system software updates you've downloaded or any files on your microSD card, such as music or photos. If you reset the device in this way, you're prompted to re-enter the same kind of information as when you first started Android.

When you are unable to power on your device, there is another way to perform a factory data reset by using hardware keys. Press the Volume up key and the Power key at same time until the screen lights up.

14 Safety information

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your device. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

TRAFFIC SAFETY

Given that studies show that using a device while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their device when the vehicle is not parked.

When driving, do not use your device or headphones to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas. When switched on, your device emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your device on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area,
- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the dashboard is adequately shielded from device RF energy.
- CONDITIONS OF USE

You are advised to switch off the device from time to time to optimize its performance.

Switch the device off before boarding an aircraft.

Switch the device off when you are in healthcare facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, these devices can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequencies.

Switch the device off when you are near gas or flammable liquids. Strictly obey all signs and instructions posted in a fuel depot, petrol station, or chemical plant, or in any potentially explosive atmosphere.

When the device is switched on, it should be kept at least 150 mm from any medical device such as a pacemaker, a hearing aid, or insulin pump, etc. In particular when using the device, you should hold it against the ear on the opposite side of the device, if applicable.

To avoid hearing impairment, move the device away from your ear while using the hands-free mode because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.
