


Set up your device

Maintaining water and dust resistance | Charge the battery | Wireless power sharing

Your device uses a nano-SIM card. A SIM card may be preinstalled, or you may be able to use your previous SIM card. This device is also compatible with an eSIM. Learn more: SIM manager

Network indicators for 5G service are based on your service provider's specifications and network availability. Contact your service provider for more details.





NOTE Your device is IP68 rated for dust and water resistance. To maintain the water-resistant and dust-resistant features of your device, make sure that the SIM card tray openings are maintained free of dust and water, and the tray is securely inserted prior to any exposure to liquids.

Maintaining water and dust resistance

Your device is rated IP68: Dust-tight. Tested for submersion in up to 5 feet of fresh water for up to 30 minutes.

Devices with IP ratings have been tested in controlled environments and certified to be water- and/or dust-resistant to the device rating specified under testing conditions.

Use your device in a manner consistent with the IP rating of your device. Failure to do so may result in damage to your device. Learn more: samsung.com/us/support/ legal/mobile

The device is not impervious to dust and water damage in any situation. It is important that all compartments are closed tightly. Any device which uses accessible compartments or ports that can be opened should have these sealed or closed tightly.

The suggestions below will help you maintain your device's performance and fulfill any warranty obligations.

- If your device is exposed to liquids other than fresh water (such as saltwater), rinse your device with fresh water dry it with a clean, soft cloth, and shake it to remove any excess water.
- If the device is dropped or receives an impact that causes physical damage to the device, the water and dust-resistant features of the device may be affected. If you suspect your device has been damaged because of a fall or impact, take it to a Samsung-authorized service center for inspection.
- Make sure to allow the device to dry before attempting to charge.
- If the device has been immersed in water or the microphone or speaker is wet, sound may not be heard clearly during a call while the device is immersed or the microphone or speaker is wet.

Getting started

- If your device is exposed to dust, wipe it with a soft, lint-free cloth to remove dust buildup.
- Do not put your device into a washer or dryer.
- Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or strong detergents to clean your device.
- Do not place any paint or painting materials (liquids) onto the device.
- Do not expose the device to water at high pressure.

Charge the battery

Your device is powered by a rechargeable battery. A USB Type-C 3A cable is included. Learn more: https://www.samsung.com/us/support/answer/ANS10001612/



NOTE Wall charger sold separately. Use only Samsung-approved chargers and cables. To avoid injury or damage to your device, do not use incompatible, worn or damaged batteries, chargers, or cables. TIP While charging, the device and the charger may become hot and stop charging. This usually does not affect the device's lifespan or performance and is in the device's normal range of operation. Wireless power sharing

Wirelessly charge your compatible Samsung devices using your phone. Some features are not available while sharing power.



- 1. From Settings, tap Battery > Wireless power sharing.
- 2. Tap **Battery limit** and choose a percentage. Once the device you are charging has reached this level of charge, wireless power sharing automatically turns off.
- 3. Tap ____ to turn on the charging feature.
- 4. With the phone face down, place the compatible device on the back of the phone to charge. A notification sound or vibration occurs when charging begins.



NOTE Wireless power sharing works with most Qi-Certified devices. Requires minimum 30% battery to share. Speed and power efficiency of charge varies by device. May not work with some accessories, covers, or other manufacturer's devices. If you have trouble connecting or charging is slow, remove any cover from each device.

For best results when using Wireless power sharing, please note:

- · Remove any accessories or cover before using the feature. Depending on the type of accessory or cover, Wireless power sharing may not work properly.
- · The location of the wireless charging coil may vary by device, so you may need to adjust the placement to make a connection. When charging starts, a notification or vibration will occur, so the notification will help you know you've made a connection.
- · Call reception or data services may be affected, depending on your network environment.
- · Charging speed or efficiency can vary depending on device condition or surrounding environment.
- · Do not use headphones while charging with Wireless power sharing.

Turn on your device

Use Side button to turn your device on. Do not use the device if the body is cracked or broken. Use the device only after it has been repaired.

- Press and hold Side button to turn the device on.
 - To turn the device off, press and hold Side button and Volume down button at the same time, and tap (U) Power off. Confirm when prompted.
 - To restart your device, press and hold Side button and Volume down button at the same time, and tap (1) **Restart**. Confirm when prompted.



TIP To learn more about powering off your device from Settings, tap 😥 Advanced features > Side button > How to power off your phone.



NOTE Best 5G performance requires optimal 5G connection and unobstructed antennas (rear of device); contact your service provider for network availability; 5G performance may be impacted by a case or cover.

Use the Setup Wizard

The first time you turn your device on, the Setup Wizard guides you through the basics of setting up your device.

Follow the prompts to choose a default language, connect to a Wi-Fi® network, set up accounts, choose location services, learn about your device's features, and more.

Transfer data for device setup

Use Smart Switch[™] to transfer contacts, photos, music, videos, messages, notes, calendars, and more from your old device. Smart Switch can transfer your data using a USB cable, Wi-Fi, or computer. Learn more: **samsung.com/smartswitch**

- 1. From Settings, tap 🕢 Accounts and backup > Transfer data for device setup.
- 2. Follow the prompts and select the content to transfer.

Lock or unlock your device

Use your device's screen lock features to secure your device. By default, the device locks automatically when the screen times out. Learn more: Lock screen and security



Side button settings

You can customize the shortcuts assigned to Side button.

Double press

Choose which feature is launched when Side button is pressed twice.

- 1. From Settings, tap 😥 Advanced features > Side button.
- 2. Tap **Double press**, tap () to enable this feature, and tap an option:
 - Camera (default)
 - Open app or function

Long press

Choose which feature is launched when you press and hold Side button.

- 1. From Settings, tap 😥 Advanced features > Side button.
- 2. Tap Long press for the following options:
 - Digital assistant (default)
 - Bixby
 - Power off menu

Accounts

Add a Google Account

Sign in to your Google Account to access your Google Cloud Storage, apps installed from your account, and make full use of your device's Android[™] features.

When you sign in to a Google Account and set a Lock screen, Google Device Protection is activated. This service requires your Google Account information when resetting to factory settings. Learn more: Google Play Protect

- 1. From Settings, tap 📀 Accounts and backup > Manage accounts.
- 2. Tap + Add account > Google.

Add a Samsung account

Sign in to your Samsung account to access exclusive Samsung content and make full use of Samsung apps.

From Settings, tap Sign in to your Galaxy.

Add an Outlook account

Sign in to your Outlook® account to manage email messages.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🕢 Accounts and backup > Manage accounts.
- 2. Tap Add account > Outlook.

Set up voicemail

You can set up your voicemail service when you access it for the first time. You can access voicemail through the Phone app. Options may vary by service provider.

- 1. From (Phone, touch and hold the 1 1 key or tap 6 Voicemail.
- 2. Follow the tutorial to create a password, record a greeting, and record your name.


Navigation

A touch screen responds best to a light touch from the pad of your finger or a capacitive stylus. Using excessive force or a metallic object on the touch screen may damage the surface of the screen and the damage will not be covered by the warranty.



TIP You can adjust the touch sensitivity or use special controls to navigate your device using your voice or gestures. Learn more: Accessibility


Tap



Lightly touch items to select or launch them.

- Tap an item to select it.
- Double-tap an image to zoom in or out.


Swipe



Lightly drag across the screen.

- Swipe the screen to unlock the device.
- Swipe the screen to scroll through the Home screens or menu options.


Drag and drop



Touch and hold an item, and then move it to a new location.

- Drag an app shortcut to add it to a Home screen.
- Drag a widget to place it in a new location.

Zoom in and out



Bring two fingers together or apart on the screen to zoom in and out.

- Move two fingers apart on the screen to zoom in.
- Move two fingers together on the screen to zoom out.

Touch and hold




Touch and hold items to activate them.

- Touch and hold a field to display a pop-up menu of options.
- Touch and hold a Home screen to customize the Home screen.

Navigation bar

You may navigate your device by using either the navigation buttons or full screen gestures.



Navigation buttons

Use buttons along the bottom of the screen for quick navigation.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🛞 **Display > Navigation bar > Buttons**.
- 2. Tap More options for the following options:
 - Tap **Button order** to choose which side of the screen the Back and Recent apps icons display.

Navigation gestures

Hide the navigation buttons at the bottom of the screen for an unobstructed screen experience. Instead swipe to navigate your device.

- From Settings, tap Display > Navigation bar > Swipe gestures to enable the feature.
- 2. Tap More options for the following options:
 - Block gestures with S Pen: Prevent the S Pen from making navigation gestures (Galaxy S25 Ultra only).
 - Gesture sensitivity: Drag the slider to adjust the sensitivity level.

Circle to Search

Circle, highlight, scribble, or tap text or images anywhere on your screen to select and search for them on Google.

- From Settings, tap Display > Navigation bar.
- 2. Tap **Circle to search** to enable the feature.

To use Circle to search:

- 1. Press and hold **Home** (or the Navigation handle in Gesture mode).
- 2. Circle, highlight, or tap anywhere on the screen to select the text, image, or video you want to search.

Customize your home screen

The Home screen is the starting point for navigating your device. You can place your favorite apps and widgets here, in addition to setting up additional Home screens, removing screens, changing the order of screens, and choosing a main Home screen.

App icons | Wallpaper | Themes | Icons | Widgets | Home screen settings | Status bar | Quick settings | Notification panel

App icons

Use app icons to launch an app from any Home screen.

From Apps, touch and hold an app icon, and tap Add to Home.

To remove an icon:

 \circ From a Home screen, touch and hold an app icon, and then tap $\overrightarrow{\Pi}$ Remove.



NOTE Removing an icon does not delete the app, it only removes the icon from a Home screen.

Wallpaper

Change the appearance of the Home and Lock screens by choosing a favorite picture, video, or preloaded wallpaper.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch and hold the screen, and then tap Nallpaper and style.
- 2. Tap one of the following menus for available wallpapers:
 - Tap the Lock screen and Home screen images to edit them.
 - Change wallpapers: Choose from a variety of wallpaper options or download more from Galaxy Themes.
 - Color palette: Choose a palette based on colors from your wallpaper.
 - Dim wallpaper when Dark mode is on: Enable to apply Dark mode to your wallpaper.

Themes

Set a theme to be applied to your Home and Lock screens, wallpapers, and applicans.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch and hold the screen, and then tap $\centcolor{}{}^{+}$ Themes.
- 2. Tap a theme to preview and download it.
- 3. Tap Menu > My stuff > Themes to access downloaded themes.
- 4. Tap a theme, and then tap **Apply** to apply the selected theme.

Icons

Apply different icon sets to replace the default icons.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch and hold the screen.
- 2. Tap Themes > Icons, and tap an icon set to preview and download it.
- 3. Tap Menu > My stuff > Icons to access downloaded icons.
- 4. Tap an icon, and then tap Apply to apply the selected icon set.

Widgets

Add widgets to your home screens for quick access to info or apps.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch and hold the screen.
- 2. Tap Widgets, and then tap a widget set to open it.
- 3. Swipe to the widget you want to choose, tap it, and then tap Add.

Customize Widgets

Once you have added a widget, you can customize where it's located and how it functions.

- From a Home screen, touch and hold a widget, and tap an option:
 - + Create stack: Add other widgets of the same size to stack in the same place on the screen.
 - Till Remove: Delete a widget from your screen.
 - 🔯 **Settings**: Customize the function or appearance of the widget.
 - (i) App info: Review the widget usage, permissions, and more.

Home screen settings

Customize your Home and Apps screens.


- 1. From Settings, tap **(n) Home screen**.
- 2. Tap an option to customize:
 - App size: Move the slider to adjust the size of apps on the Home and Apps screen.
 - App labels: Enable or disable app labels on Home screens.
 - Widget labels: Enable or disable labels for widgets.
 - Home screen layout: Set your device to have separate Home and Apps screens, or only a Home screen where all apps are located.
 - Home screen grid: Choose a layout to determine how icons are arranged on the Home screen.
 - Apps screen grid: Choose a layout to determine how icons are arranged on the Apps screen.
 - Folder grid: Choose a layout to determine how folders are arranged.
 - Add media page to Home screen: When enabled swipe right from the Home screen to open a media page. Tap to display available media services.
 - Show Apps screen button on Home screen: Add a button to the Home screen for direct access to the Apps screen.
 - Lock Home screen layout: Prevent items on the Home screen from being removed or repositioned.
 - Add new apps to Home screen: Automatically add newly-downloaded apps to the Home screen.
 - **Hide apps on Home and Apps screens**: Choose apps to hide from the Home and App screens. Return to this screen to restore hidden apps. Hidden apps are still installed and can appear as results in Finder searches.
 - App icon badges: Enable to show badges on apps with active notifications.
 You can also choose the badge style.
 - Swipe down for notification panel: Enable this feature to open the Notification panel by swiping down anywhere on the Home screen.
 - Rotate to landscape mode: Rotate the Home screen automatically when your device's orientation is changed from portrait to landscape.


Status bar

The Status bar provides device information on the right side and notification alerts on the left.


TIP From Settings, tap O Notifications > Status bar to configure settings for Status bar notifications.

Quick settings

The Notification panel provides access to device functions using Quick settings.

- Swipe down from the top right corner of the screen to display Quick settings.
 - Tap a Quick setting icon to turn it on or off.
 - · Touch and hold a Quick setting icon to open the setting.

Here are some of the most common Quick settings. Other settings may be available on your device.





TIP Live translations of spoken conversations are available through the Interpreter Quick setting.


Quick settings options

The following options are available in Quick settings.

- Edit: Change the order and display options for the Quick settings.
- (1) Power off: Power off, Restart, Emergency call, and Medical info options.
- · Settings: Access the device's settings menu.

Notification panel

For access to notifications, settings, and more, open the Notification panel.



Open the Notification panel

You can access the Notification panel from any screen.

- 1. Swipe down from the top of the screen (avoid the top right corner) to display the Notification panel.
 - To open an item, tap it.
 - To clear a single notification, drag the notification left or right.
 - To clear all notifications, tap Clear.
 - To customize notifications, tap Notification settings.
- 2. Swipe upward from the bottom of the screen or tap \(\) Back to close the Notification panel.

SPen

The Galaxy S25 Ultra supports the S Pen.

The S Pen provides a variety of helpful functions. Use your S Pen to launch apps, take notes, or draw a picture. Some S Pen functions, such as tapping the screen, may not work if the device is near a magnet.



TIP You can configure S Pen settings from 😥 Advanced features > S Pen.

Remove the S Pen

The S Pen stores in the bottom of your device for convenient access. It also charges the S Pen so that it can be used for remote functions.

Push the S Pen inward to release it, and then slide it out.



NOTE To maintain the water-resistant and dust-resistant features of your device, make sure the S Pen slot and opening are both kept free of dust and water, and the pen is securely inserted prior to any exposure to liquids.

Configure S Pen settings

Settings for the S Pen can be customized to your preferences.

- From Settings, tap ② Advanced features > S Pen to configure the following settings:
 - Air actions: Configure how the remote control functions while using apps.
 - **Air command**: Configure the shortcuts, appearance, and behavior of the Air command menu.
 - Air view: Turn Air view on or off.
 - More S Pen settings: Configure other behaviors for the S Pen.
 - About S Pen features: Display version information for the S Pen features.
 - Contact us: Contact Samsung support through Samsung Members.

Galaxy Al

Use Galaxy Al features with compatible Galaxy apps on your device to unleash your productivity, enhance your communication, and create epic images.

- From Settings, tap Galaxy Al, and sign in to your Samsung account. Tap an option to use advanced intelligence features:
 - Call assist: Get real-time translation during voice calls.
 - Writing assist: Change the writing style, get spelling and grammar suggestions, and translate messages in select chat and text messaging apps.
 - Interpreter: Live translation of spoken conversations available as voice or text output.
 - Note assist: Automatically format, summarize, correct, and generate covers for your notes.
 - **Transcript assist**: Transform recordings into text transcripts and summaries so you can review or translate them.
 - Browsing assist: Get simple summaries and translations of webpage text.
 - **Photo assist:** Edit images by repositioning, removing, or resizing people or objects and sketching things into the background.

- **Drawing assist**: Transform simple drawings into works of art and add new elements to existing images.
- Audio eraser: Eliminate distracting noise in videos by adjusting the volume of voices, wind, and other sounds in Video editor.
- Photo ambient wallpaper: Allow advanced intelligence to change your wallpaper based on the time and weather.
- Now brief: Get personalized briefing with suggested content and actions that change throughout the day.
- Health assist: Get insights into your daily health metrics.
- Process data only on device: For added privacy, process advanced intelligence data on your device instead of online. Some features are not available when this option is enabled.
- About advanced intelligence: Learn how advanced intelligence works and uses your data.
- Terms and conditions: Review the terms and conditions for advanced intelligence.

Modes and Routines

Set up modes and routines to automatically change your device's settings to match your activity or situation.

- From Settings, tap Modes and Routines for the following pages:
 - Modes: Choose a mode based on what you are doing or where you are.
 - Routines: Create routines for your device based on times or places.
 - **Discover**: Use suggested template modes and routines.

Digital wellbeing and parental controls

You can monitor and manage your digital habits by getting a daily breakdown of how frequently you use apps, how many notifications you receive, and how often you check your device. You can also set your device to help you wind down before going to bed.

- From Settings, tap **Digital Wellbeing and parental controls** for the following features:
 - Tap the Dashboard to review screen time, notifications received, and unlocks.
 - Most used app categories: Review which app categories are used the most. Tap a category for more details.
 - Screen time goal: Set a screen time goal and check your daily average.
 - App timers: Set a daily limit for how long you use each app.
 - Driving monitor: Review your screen time while connected to your car's Bluetooth and which apps you use the most.
 - Walking monitor: Review how much time you use your device while walking.
 - **Volume monitor**: Choose a sound source to monitor the volume and keep your ears safe.
 - Content restrictions: Review a list of restrictions.
 - **Parental controls**: Supervise your children's digital life with Google's Family Link app. You can choose apps, set content filters, keep an eye on screen time, and set screen time limits.

Always On Display

Display missed calls and message alerts, check the time and date, and more without unlocking your device using Always On Display (AOD).

- 1. From Settings, tap 1 Lock screen and AOD > Always On Display.
- 2. Tap ___ to enable the feature, and then set the following options:
 - Show Lock screen wallpaper: Choose to show or hide the wallpaper on the Lock screen.
 - Erase background: Show the main subject of the photo only.

Getting started

- Show Now bar: Display a bar at the bottom of your screen with useful information.
- When to show: Choose when to show a clock and notifications on the screen when your device is not in use.
- About Always On Display: Display the current software version and license information.
- Contact us: Contact Samsung support through Samsung Members.


AOD themes

Apply custom themes for Always On Display.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch and hold the screen, and tap Themes > AODs.
 - Tap an AOD to preview and download it to My Always On Displays.
- 2. Tap Menu > My stuff > AODs to access downloaded themes.
- 3. Tap an AOD, and then tap Apply.

Multi window

Multitask by using multiple apps at the same time. Apps that support Multi window can be displayed together on a split screen. You can switch between the apps and adjust the size of their windows.



- 1. From any screen, tap | | Recent apps.
- 2. Tap the app icon, and then tap Open in split screen view.
- 3. Tap an app in the other window to add it to the split screen view.
 - Drag the middle of the window border to adjust the window size.

Window controls

The Window controls modify the way app windows are displayed in split screen view.

- Tap the middle of the window border for the following options:
 - 1 Switch window: Swap the two windows.
 - Add app pair to: Create and add an app pair shortcut to the Home screen or Apps edge panel.

Multi window gestures

Configure Multi window features to launch with swipe gestures.

- From Settings, tap (1) Advanced features > Multi window for the following options:
 - Swipe for split screen: Swipe two fingers across either screen from the side or bottom to change to Split screen view. Swipe again to switch apps.
 - Swipe for pop-up view: Swipe from the top corner of the screen toward the middle to change the window to pop-up view.
 - Full screen in split screen view: Hide the Status and Navigation bars when in split screen view. Swipe from the respective edges of the screen to show the hidden bars.

Enter text

Text can be entered using a keyboard or your voice.



Toolbar

The toolbar provides quick access to features of the keyboard. Options may vary by service provider.

- From the Samsung keyboard, tap ••• Expand toolbar for the following options:
 - Writing assist: Change the tone of your writing and get spelling and grammar suggestions.
 - © Emojis: Explore different types of emojis, GIFs, create custom combined emojis, and more.
 - Translate: Type words or sentences to translate them into another language.
 - Clipboard: Access the clipboard.
 - Implies: Select a keyboard layout.
 - To Handwriting: Use your handwriting to enter text (Galaxy S25 Ultra only).
 - Settings: Access keyboard settings.
 - 🔝 One-handed keyboard: Switch to a layout for one-handed use.
 - [T] Extract text: Identify and extract text from the selected content.
 - (+) **Edit toolbar**: Add or remove options from the toolbar.

Configure the Samsung keyboard

Set customized options for the Samsung keyboard.

- From the Samsung keyboard, tap Settings for the following options:
 - Languages and types: Set the keyboard type and choose which languages are available on the keyboard.
 - To switch between languages, swipe the Space bar left or right.



 - When you tap the screen, a brightness scale appears. Drag the slider to adjust the brightness.
 - To switch between the front and rear cameras, swipe the screen up or down.
 - To zoom at a precise level, tap a zoom magnification number at the bottom of the screen. (Only available when using the rear camera.)
 - To change to a different shooting mode, swipe the screen right or left.

- 1. From (3) Contacts, tap a contact.
- 2. Tap Share.
- 3. Tap either vCard file (VCF) or Text.
- 4. Choose a sharing method and follow the prompts.
- TIP When a contact is selected, tap More > QR code to share the information with friends or family. The QR code automatically updates when you change the contact information fields.

Groups

You can use groups to organize your contacts. Options may vary by service provider.

Create a group

Create your own contact groups.

- 1. From (3) Contacts, tap Groups.
- 2. Tap Create, and then tap fields to enter information about the group:
 - Group name: Enter a name for the new group.
 - Group ringtone: Customize the sounds for the group.
 - Add member: Select contacts to add to the new group, and then tap Done.







- From Phone, enter a number on the keypad and tap Call.
 - Tap Keypad if the keypad is not displayed.

Make a call from Recents

All incoming, outgoing, and missed calls are recorded in the Call log.

- 1. From **()** Phone, tap Recents to display a list of recent calls.
- 2. Tap a contact, and then tap 📞 Call.

Make a call from Contacts

Call a contact from the Contacts app.

From (3) Contacts, swipe a contact to the right to call that contact.

Answer a call

When a call is received, the phone rings and the caller's phone number or name is displayed. If you are using an app, a pop-up screen is displayed for the incoming call.

On the incoming call screen, drag 📞 Answer to the right to answer the call.

Decline a call

You can choose to decline an incoming call. If you are using an app, a pop-up screen is displayed for the incoming call.

On the incoming call screen, drag Decline to the left to reject the call and send it to your voicemail.

Decline with a message

You can choose to decline an incoming call with a text message response.

On the incoming call screen, drag Send message upward and select a message.

End a call

Tap C End call when you are ready to end your call.

Actions while on a call

You can adjust call volume, switch to a headset or speaker, and even multitask while on a call.

- From the Call screen, tap an option:
 - Record: Record calls and save them in the Voice Recorder app. The other party hears a message that the call is being recorded.
 - (II) Text call: Use the voice assistant to convert text into voice.
 - Add call: Make another call while a call is in progress. Options may vary by service provider.
 - Video call: Use your camera during a call. Not all devices support video calling. The receiver has the option to accept the video call or answer the call as a regular voice call.

 - **(1) Speaker**: Listen to the call using the speaker.
 - W Mute: to turn off the microphone.
 - Keypad: Display the keypad while on a call.

Multitask

If you exit the call screen to use another app, your active call is indicated in the Status bar.

To return to the call screen:

Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel and tap the call.

To end a call while multitasking:

 Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel, and then tap End call.

Call background

Select a picture or video to show when you make or receive a call.

- From Phone, tap More options > Settings > Call background for the following options:
 - Tap the image to preview the background.
 - Tap Background to choose a photo or video to display during a call.

Call pop-up settings

When calls are received while using other apps, they can be displayed as pop-ups.

- From Phone, tap More options > Settings > Call display while using apps. The following options are available:
 - Full screen: Display an incoming call in the full screen Phone app.
 - Small pop-up: Display an incoming call as a pop-up at the top of the screen.
 - Mini pop-up: Display an incoming call as a smaller pop-up.
 - **Keep calls in pop-up**: Enable this option to keep calls in the pop-up after they are answered.

Manage calls

Your calls are recorded in a call log. You can set up speed dials, block numbers, and use voicemail.

Call log

The numbers of the calls you have dialed, received, or missed are stored in the Call log.

From Phone, tap Recents. A list of recent calls is displayed. If the caller is in your Contacts list, the caller's name is displayed.

Apps

Save a contact from a recent call

Use recent call information to create a contact or update your Contacts list.

- 1. From Phone, tap Recents.
- 2. Tap the call that contains the information that you want to save to your Contacts list, and tap **Add to contacts**.
- 3. Tap Create new contact or Update existing contact.

Delete call records

To delete Call log entries:

Block a number

By adding a caller to your Block list, future calls from this number are sent directly to your voicemail, and messages are not received.

- TIP You can also modify your Block list in Settings. From Phone, tap More options > Settings > Block numbers.

Speed dial

You can assign a shortcut number to a contact for speed dialing their default number.

- 1. From Phone, tap Keypad > More options > Speed dial numbers. The Speed dial numbers screen displays the reserved speed dial numbers.
- 2. Tap an unassigned number.
 - Tap Menu to select a different Speed dial number than the next one in sequence.
 - Number 1 is reserved for Voicemail.
- 3. Type in a name or number, or tap Add from Contacts to assign a contact to the number.
 - The selected contact is displayed in the Speed dial number box.

Make a call with Speed dial

You can make a call using Speed dial.

- From Phone, touch and hold the Speed dial number.
 - If the Speed dial number is more than one digit long, enter the first digits, and then hold the last digit.

Remove a Speed dial number

You can remove an assigned Speed dial number.

Emergency calls

You can dial the emergency telephone number in your region regardless of the phone's service status. If your phone is not activated, you can only make an emergency call.



Wi-Fi

You can connect your device to a Wi-Fi network to access the Internet without using your mobile data.

- 1. From Settings, tap Connections > Wi-Fi, and then tap to turn on Wi-Fi and scan for available networks.
- 2. Tap a network, and enter a password if required.
- 3. Tap Connect.

Connect to a hidden Wi-Fi network

If the Wi-Fi network you want is not listed after a scan, you can still connect to it by entering the information manually. Ask the Wi-Fi network administrator for the name and password before you begin.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🛜 Connections > Wi-Fi, and then tap 🔵 to turn on Wi-Fi.
- 2. Tap Add network at the bottom of the list.
- 3. Enter information about the Wi-Fi network:
 - Network name: Type the exact name of the network.
 - Security: Select a security option from the list, and enter the password if required.
 - Password: Enter the network password.
 - Hidden network: Add a hidden network.
 - View more: Define other advanced options, such as IP and Proxy settings.
- 4. Tap Save.



- TIP Tap [課] Scan QR code to connect to a Wi-Fi network by using your device's camera to scan a QR code.

Wi-Fi settings

You can configure connections to various types of Wi-Fi networks and hotspots, manage saved networks and look up your device's network addresses. Options may vary by service provider.

Rename a paired device

You can rename a paired device to make it more recognizable.

- 2. Tap Settings next to the device name, and then tap Rename.
- 3. Enter a new name, and tap Rename.

Unpair from a Bluetooth device

When you unpair from a Bluetooth device, the two devices no longer recognize each other, and you need to pair with the device again in order to connect to it.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🛜 Connections > Bluetooth, and then tap 🔵 to turn on Bluetooth.
- 2. Tap Settings next to the device, and then tap Unpair.
- 3. Tap Unpair to confirm.

Advanced Bluetooth settings

Additional Bluetooth features are available in the Advanced menu. Options may vary by service provider.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🛜 Connections > Bluetooth.

Dual audio

You can play audio from your device to two connected Bluetooth audio devices.

NFC and payment

Near Field Communication (NFC) allows you to communicate with another device without connecting to a network. This technology is used by Android Beam and certain payment apps. The device that you are transferring to needs to support NFC, and it needs to be within four centimeters of your device.

From Settings, tap Connections > NFC and contactless payments, and then tap to turn on this feature.

Tap and pay

Use an NFC payment app to make payments by touching your device to a compatible credit card reader.

- 1. From Settings, tap Connections > NFC and contactless payments, and then tap to turn on NFC.
- 2. Tap **Default wallet app** to select or change your default payment app.
 - To see a list of services not related to payment, tap Non-payment NFC services.

Airplane mode

Airplane mode turns off all network connections including calling, texting, mobile data, Wi-Fi, and Bluetooth. While Airplane mode is enabled, you can turn on Wi-Fi and Bluetooth in Settings or from the Quick settings panel.

From Settings, tap 🛜 Connections > Airplane mode, and then tap 🔵 to enable this feature.



NOTE Do not use Ultra-wideband (UWB) aboard aircraft or ships. Turn it off by using Airplane mode, which disables all network connectivity. The use of other features of this mobile device on an aircraft or a ship is subject to federal and local guidelines and restrictions. Always follow crew instructions regarding when and how you may use your device.

SIM manager

Your wireless service provider and service plan may support the ability to use a dual SIM (two physical SIM cards) or an eSIM (embedded SIM) so that you can manage two mobile accounts without carrying two devices. Options may vary by service provider.

Devices that support dual SIM contain two SIM card slots. It may also have a microSD card slot for expandable storage if supported. Devices that support dual SIM will receive software updates that enable the built-in dual SIM capability after launch.

Devices that support an eSIM can be programmed to work independently of the physical SIM card in the device. This allows for either the eSIM or the physical SIM card to be used for voice call/text and data. Devices that support eSIM will receive software updates that enable the built-in eSIM capability after launch.

- From Settings, tap (a) Connections > SIM manager for the following options:
 - SIM cards: Enable, disable, or rename installed physical SIM cards in your device.
 - eSIMs: Tap Add eSIM to sign up for a new eSIM mobile plan or to add a plan from an old device.

Settings

- Primary SIM: When using multiple SIM cards, set a primary card to be used for calls, texts, and data.
- More SIM settings: Tap to explore additional management options for your SIM cards.

Mobile networks



 - **Data saver**: Enable to prevent selected apps from sending or receiving data in the background.
 - Allowed networks for apps: Set whether apps can use Wi-Fi only, mobile data only, or both.
 - Mobile: Configure mobile data settings available from your service provider.
 - Wi-Fi data usage: Display data usage over Wi-Fi connections over a period of time.

Mobile hotspot

Mobile hotspot uses your data plan to create a Wi-Fi network that can be used by multiple devices. Options may vary by service provider.

- From Settings, tap Connections > Mobile hotspot and tethering > Mobile hotspot.
- 2. Tap to turn on Mobile hotspot.
- 3. On the devices you want to connect, activate Wi-Fi, and select your device's Mobile hotspot. Enter the Mobile hotspot password to connect.



Configure mobile hotspot settings

You can customize your mobile hotspot's security and connection settings.

- From Settings, tap Connections > Mobile hotspot and tethering > Mobile hotspot.
- 2. Tap to turn on Mobile hotspot, and then tap the following settings to change them:
 - Network name: Change the name of your Mobile hotspot.
 - Password: If you choose a security level that uses a password, you can display or change it.
 - Band: Select one of the available bandwidth options.
- 3. Tap **Save**.

Auto hotspot

Share your hotspot connection automatically with other devices signed in to your Samsung account.

- From Settings, tap Connections > Mobile hotspot and tethering > Mobile hotspot.
- 2. Tap **Auto hotspot**, and tap **to enable the feature.**

One-time password

You can share this password with guests to allow them to use your Mobile Hotspot temporarily. The next time you turn on the Mobile Hotspot, the password is reset.

- From Settings, tap Connections > Mobile hotspot and tethering > Mobile hotspot.
- 2. Tap One-time password, and tap ____ to enable the feature.

Tethering

You can use tethering to share your device's Internet connection with another device. Options may vary by service provider.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🛜 Connections > Mobile hotspot and tethering.
- 2. Tap an option:
 - Tap Bluetooth tethering to share your device's Internet connection using Bluetooth.
 - Connect the computer to the device using a USB cable, and then tap USB tethering.
 - Connect the computer to the device using an Ethernet adapter, and then tap Ethernet tethering.

Nearby device scanning

Set up connections to other available devices by turning on Nearby device scanning. This feature sends you a notification when there are available devices to connect to.

- From Settings, tap Connections > More connection settings > Nearby device scanning.
- 2. Tap to turn on the feature.

Connect to a printer

Connect your device to a printer on the same Wi-Fi network to print documents and images from your device.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🛜 Connections > More connection settings > Printing.
- 2. Tap Default print service, and then tap More options > Add printer.



NOTE Not all apps support printing.

Virtual Private Networks

A Virtual Private Network (VPN) allows you to connect to a private secured network from your device. You will need the connection information from your VPN administrator.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🛜 Connections > More connection settings > VPN.
- 2. Tap More options > Add VPN profile.
- Enter the VPN network information provided by your network administrator, and tap **Save**.

Manage a VPN

Use the VPN settings menu to edit or delete a VPN connection.

- From Settings, tap Connections > More connection settings > VPN.
- 2. Tap **Settings** next to a VPN.
- Edit the VPN and tap Save, or tap Delete to remove the VPN.

Connect to a VPN

Once you set up a VPN, your device saves the information so that you can connect again without the initial set up.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🛜 Connections > More connection settings > VPN.
- Tap a VPN, enter your log in information, and tap Connect.
 - To disconnect, tap the VPN, and then tap Disconnect.

Private DNS

You can configure your device to connect to a private DNS host.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🛜 Connections > More connection settings > Private DNS.
- 2. Tap one of the available options to configure a private DNS connection.
- 3. Tap Save.

Ethernet

If wireless network connection is not available, you can use an Ethernet cable to connect your device to a local network.

- 1. Connect an Ethernet cable to your device.
- 2. From Settings, tap 🛜 Connections > More connection settings > Ethernet, and follow the prompts.



TIP You need an adapter (not included) to connect an Ethernet cable to your device.

Auto update system configurations

Allow automatic configuration changes to ensure that network connection features work as expected. Even when this is off, your device configuration may be updated automatically to ensure the safety, security, and functionality of your device.

 From Settings, tap (a) Connections > More connection settings > Auto update system configurations to turn on the feature.

Connected devices

Achieve mobile continuity between your device and other connected devices. Options may vary by service provider.

- From Settings, tap Connected devices for the following features:
 - Quick Share: Allow anyone with a Samsung account to share files with your device.
 - Music Share: Let nearby friends play music on your Bluetooth speaker.

- Auto switch Buds: Automatically switch your Galaxy Buds from another device to this device when you make a call, answer a call, or play media.
- Call & text on other devices: Make and answer calls and text messages from your Galaxy devices that are signed in to your Samsung account.
- Continue on other devices: Pick up where you left off on your Galaxy devices that are signed in to your Samsung account.
- Camera Share: Use the device's camera as a webcam for a nearby tablet or Galaxy Book.
- Storage Share: Share access to your device storage.
- Link to Windows: Connect your device and Windows PC to get instant access to your device's photos, messages and more.
- Multi control: Use the cursor and keyboard from your Galaxy Book to control this device and drag things back and forth.
- Samsung DeX: Connect your device to a PC or TV for an enhanced multitasking experience.
- Smart View: Show your device's screen or play videos on a nearby TV.
- Galaxy Wearable: Connect your device to your Samsung watch and earbuds.
- SmartThings: Use your device to connect to an ecosystem of smarter living solutions.
- Android Auto: Connect your device and compatible car displays so that you can focus on driving.

Sound mode

You can change the sound mode on your device without using Volume buttons.

- From Settings, tap Sounds and vibration, and then choose a mode:
 - Sound: Use the sounds, vibrations, and volume levels you have chosen in Sound settings for notifications and alerts.
 - **Vibrate while ringing**: Set your device to vibrate in addition to ringing when you receive a call.
 - Vibrate: Use vibration only for notifications and alerts.
 - Mute: Set your device to make no sounds.
 - Temporary mute: Set a time limit for muting the device.



TIP Use the sound mode setting instead of Volume buttons to change the sound mode without losing your customized sound levels.

Mute with gestures

Quickly mute sounds by covering the screen or turning the device over.

From Settings, tap (1) Advanced features > Motions and gestures > Mute with gestures, and tap (1) to enable.

Vibrations

You can control how and when your device vibrates. Options may vary by service provider.

- 1. From Settings, tap (1) Sounds and vibration.
- 2. Tap options to customize:
 - Call vibration: Choose from preset vibration patterns for calls.
 - **Notification vibration**: Choose from preset vibration patterns for notifications.
 - System vibration: Configure vibration intensity and feedback for the following options:
 - System vibration intensity: Drag the slider to adjust vibration intensity.
 - Touch interactions: Vibrate when you tap navigation buttons or touch and hold items on the screen.
 - Dialing keypad: Vibrate when dialing numbers on the Phone keypad.
 - Samsung keyboard: Vibrate when typing with the Samsung keyboard.
 - Charging: Vibrate when a charger is connected.
 - Navigation gestures: Vibrate when using gestures.
 - Camera feedback: Vibrate when taking pictures, zooming, changing shooting modes, and more.
 - Vibration intensity: Set vibration intensity levels for calls, notifications, and touch interactions by dragging the sliders.

Volume

Set the volume level for call ringtones, notifications, media, and system sounds.

 From Settings, tap (1) Sounds and vibration > Volume, and drag the sliders for each sound type.



TIP You can also use Volume buttons to adjust the volume. When pressed, a popup menu shows the volume level and current sound type. You can tap the menu to expand it, and then adjust the volume of the other sound types by dragging their sliders.

Use Volume buttons for media

Set the default action of Volume buttons to control the media sound volume rather than whichever sound type is in use.

- 1. From Settings, tap (1) Sounds and vibration > Volume.
- 2. Tap Use Volume buttons for media to enable this feature.

Media volume limit

Limit the maximum output of the device's volume while using Bluetooth speakers or headphones (not included).

- 1. From Settings, tap (1) Sounds and vibration > Volume.
- 2. Tap More options > Media volume limit.
- 3. Tap to enable this feature.
 - To set the maximum output volume, drag the Custom volume limit slider.

Ringtone

Customize your call ringtone by choosing from preset sounds or adding your own. Options may vary by service provider.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🕠 Sounds and vibration > Ringtone.
- 2. Drag the slider to adjust the ringtone volume.
- 3. Tap a ringtone to hear a preview and select it, or tap Add to use an audio file as a ringtone.

Notification sound

Choose a preset sound for all notification alerts.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🕔 Sounds and vibration > Notification sound.
- 2. Drag the slider to adjust the notification sound volume.
- 3. Tap a sound to hear a preview and select it.

System sound

Customize your device's sounds for actions like tapping the screen and charging the device. Options may vary by service provider.

- From Settings, tap Sounds and vibration > System sound for the following options:
 - System sound volume: Drag the slider to adjust the system volume.
 - System sound theme: Choose a sound theme to use for touch interactions, charging, changing the sound mode, and Samsung Keyboard, and more.
 - Touch interactions: Play tones when you touch or tap the screen to make selections.
 - Dialing keypad: Play a tone when dialing numbers on the Phone keypad.
 - Samsung keyboard: Play a sound when typing with the Samsung keyboard.
 - · Charging: Play a sound when a charger is connected.
 - Screen lock/unlock: Play a sound when you lock or unlock the screen.

Dolby Atmos

Enjoy Dolby Atmos quality when playing content that was specifically mixed for Atmos. This feature may only be available with a headset connected.

 - Dolby Atmos: Experience breakthrough audio that flows above and around you.

Equalizer

Choose an audio preset that is customized to different genres of music, or manually change your audio settings.

- 1. From Settings, tap (1) Sounds and vibration > Sound quality and effects.
- 2. Tap **Equalizer** to choose a music genre.

Boost dialogue

Make it easier to hear voices in videos that have other background sound.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🕠 Sounds and vibration > Sound quality and effects.
- 2. Tap Boost dialogue to enable.

Loudness normalization

Adjust the recording based on perceived loudness. Normalization adjusts the gain by a constant value.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🕠 Sounds and vibration > Sound quality and effects.
- 2. Tap Loudness normalization to enable.

App sound settings

When you change the sound settings using the Quick panel while using a media app, those settings are saved and applied the next time you use that app.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🕠 Sounds and vibration > Sound quality and effects.
- 2. Tap App sound settings to enable.

Adapt sound

Customize the sound for each ear and enhance your listening experience.

- From Settings, tap Sounds and vibration > Sound quality and effects > Adapt sound.
- 2. Tap Adapt sound for to select when to change the sound settings.
- 3. Tap the sound profile that fits you best, and tap 🐼 Settings to customize.
- TIP Tap Add personalized sound profile to let your device identify the best sound for you.

UHQ upscaler

Enhance the sound resolution of music and videos for a clearer listening experience. This feature is only available with a headset connected.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🕠 Sounds and vibration > Sound quality and effects.
- 2. Tap UHQ upscaler and choose an upscaling option.

Separate app sound

You can choose to have an app play only media sound on a Bluetooth speaker or headset separate from the other sounds (like notifications). Connect to a Bluetooth device to make this option available in the Audio device menu.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🕠 Sounds and vibration > Separate app sound.
- Tap Turn on now to enable Separate app sound, and then set the following options:
 - App: Choose an app to play its sound on a separate audio device.
 - Audio device: Choose the audio device that you want the app's sound to be played on.

Notifications

You can prioritize and streamline app alerts by changing which apps send notifications and how notifications alert you.

App notifications

Choose which apps are allowed to send you notifications.

 From Settings, tap O Notifications > App notifications, and then tap to enable notifications for individual apps.

Lock screen notifications

Choose which notifications are allowed on the Lock screen.

- From Settings, tap Notifications > Lock screen notifications, and then tap to enable the feature. Tap an option to customize:
 - Notification style: Choose to display notifications on the Lock screen as dots, icons, or cards.
 - Show content: Show notifications in the Notification panel.
 - Hide content: Do not show notifications in the Notification panel.
 - Show alerting notifications only: Choose which notifications to show on the Lock screen.

Status bar

Customize how notifications are displayed in the Status bar.

- From Settings, tap Notifications > Status bar for the following options:
 - Notification style: Choose to display notifications as dots, icons, or none.
 - Show battery percentage: Display the current battery life of your device.

Notification pop-up style

You can change the style and additional settings for your notifications.

Do not disturb

Do not disturb allows you to block sounds and notifications while this mode is turned on. You can also specify exceptions for people, apps, and alarms. You can also set a schedule for recurring events like sleep or meetings.

 - Do not disturb: Enable Do not disturb to block sounds and notifications.
 - For how long?: Choose a default duration for Do not disturb mode when you enable it manually.

Schedule

- **Sleeping**: Customize a schedule for Do not disturb mode while you are sleeping.
- Add schedule: Create a new schedule to configure the days and times to regularly put your device in Do not disturb mode.

Allowed during Do not disturb

- Calls and messages: Tap to allow Do not disturb exceptions.
- App notifications: Add apps that you would like to receive notifications from in Do not disturb mode. Call, message, and conversation notifications will still reach you even if you don't allow the associated apps.
- Alarms and sounds: Enable sounds and vibrations for alarms, events, and reminders while Do not disturb mode is active.
- Hide notifications: Customize options to hide notifications.

Advanced notifications settings

- Show snooze button: Enable to display a button to quickly snooze your notifications.
- Repeat notification alerts: Enable and customize periodic reminders about notifications from selected apps and services. Clear notifications to stop the reminders.
- App icon badges: Identify which apps have active notifications with badges that appear on their icons. Tap to choose whether or not badges indicate the number of unread notifications.
- Manage notification categories for each app: Show the notification categories menu on the notification settings screen for each app.
- Wireless Emergency Alerts: Customize notifications for emergency alerts.

Alert when phone picked up

 - Dark mode settings: Customize when and where Dark mode is applied.
 - Turn on as scheduled: Configure Dark mode for either Sunset to sunrise or Custom schedule.

Screen brightness

Adjust the screen brightness according to lighting conditions or personal preference.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🔆 Display.
- 2. Customize options under Brightness:
 - Drag the Brightness slider to set a custom brightness level.
 - Tap Adaptive brightness to automatically adjust the screen brightness based on the lighting conditions.



TIP You can also adjust screen brightness from the Quick settings panel.

Motion smoothness

Get smoother scrolling and more realistic animations by increasing the screen's refresh rate.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🛞 Display > Motion smoothness.
- 2. Tap an option, and then tap Apply.

Eye comfort shield

This feature may help you sleep better and reduce eye strain. You can set a schedule to automatically turn this feature on and off.

- 1. From Settings, tap ③ Display > Eye comfort shield, and then tap ① to enable this feature.
- 2. Tap an option to customize:
 - Adaptive: Automatically adjust your screen's color temperature based on your usage patterns and the time of day.
 - Custom: Set a schedule for when Eye comfort shield should be enabled.
 - Tap Set schedule and choose Always on, Sunset to sunrise, or Custom.
 - Drag the **Color temperature** slider to set the opacity of the filter.
 - Enhanced comfort: Adjust color tones and contrast of the display for more comfortable viewing.

Adaptive color tone

Adjust the colors and white balance based on ambient lighting conditions to make colors appear more natural in different environments.

From Settings, tap Display > Adaptive color tone and tap to enable this feature.

Screen mode

Your device has several screen mode options which adjust the screen quality for different situations. You can select the mode according to your preference.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🔀 **Display > Screen mode**.
- 2. Tap an option to set a different screen mode.
 - Drag the slider to adjust the white balance.
 - Tap Advanced settings to manually change the RGB values.

Font size and style

You can change the font size and style to customize your device.

- From Settings, tap (S) Display > Font size and style for the following options:
 - Tap Font style to choose a different font.
 - Tap a font to select it, or tap Download fonts to add fonts from Galaxy Store.
 - Tap Bold font to make all fonts appear with bold weight.
 - Drag the Font size slider to adjust the size of text.

Screen zoom

Adjust the zoom level to make content larger or smaller.

Camera cutout

You can hide the camera cutout area with a black bar.

Easy mode

Edge panels

The Edge panels feature a variety of customizable panels that can be accessed from the edge of the screen. Edge panels can be used to access apps, tasks, and contacts, as well as check news, sports, and other information.

From Settings, tap Display > Edge panels, tap to enable this feature.

Apps panel

You can add apps to the Apps panel.

- From any screen, drag the Edge handle to the center of the screen. Swipe until
 the Apps panel is displayed.
- 2. Tap an app or app pair shortcut to open it. You can also tap ••• All apps button for the complete app list.
 - To open additional windows in pop-up view, drag the app icon from the Apps panel to the open screen.

To configure Apps panel:

- 2. Tap Fait button to add other apps to the Apps panel.
 - To add an app to the Apps panel, find it on the left side of the screen and tap it to add it to an available space on the right column.
 - To create a folder shortcut, drag an app from the left side of the screen on top of an app in the columns on the right.
 - To change the order of the apps on the panel, drag each app to the desired location.
 - To remove an app, tap Remove.

Edge panel position and style

Accidental touch protection

Prevent the screen from detecting touch input while the device is in a dark place, such as a pocket or a bag.

From Settings, tap Display > Accidental touch protection to enable the feature.

Touch sensitivity

Increase the touch sensitivity of the screen for use with screen protectors.

From Settings, tap Display > Touch sensitivity to enable.

Show charging information


Battery level and estimated time until the device is fully charged can be displayed when the screen is off.

From Settings, tap Sisplay > Show charging information to enable.

Screen saver

You can display colors or photos when the screen turns off or while charging.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🔀 Display > Screen saver.
- 2. Choose one of the following options:
 - None: Do not display a screen saver.
 - Colors: Tap the selector to display a changing screen of colors.
 - Device control: Display device control options.
 - Photo table: Display pictures in a photo table.
 - **Photo frame**: Display pictures in a photo frame.
 - Photos: Display pictures from your Google Photos account.
- 3. Tap Preview for a demonstration of the selected Screen saver.



TIP Tap Settings next to a feature for additional options.

Lift to wake

Turn on the screen by lifting the device.

From Settings, tap (1) Advanced features > Motions and gestures > Lift to wake to enable this feature.

Double tap to turn on screen

Turn on the screen by double-tapping instead of using Side button.

From Settings, tap & Advanced features > Motions and gestures > Double tap to turn on screen to enable this feature.

Double tap to turn off screen

Turn off the screen by double-tapping instead of using Side button.

 From Settings, tap (+) Advanced features > Motions and gestures > Double tap to turn off screen to enable this feature.

One-handed mode

You can change the screen layout to accommodate operating your device with one hand.

- 1. From Settings, tap 😥 Advanced features > One-handed mode.
- 2. Tap () to enable the feature and select one of the following options:
 - Gesture: Swipe down in the center of the bottom edge of the screen.
 - Button: Tap Home two times in quick succession to reduce the display size.

 - Show content: Show notifications in the Notification panel.
 - **Hide content**: Do not show notifications in the Notification panel.
 - Show alerting notifications only: Silent notifications will not be displayed.
- 3. Tap **Done** to exit the menu.
- 4. Configure the following screen lock options:
 - Extend unlock: Unlock your device automatically when trusted locations or other devices have been detected. A secure screen lock is required for this feature.
 - Secure lock settings: Customize your secure lock settings. A secure screen lock is required for this feature.
 - Always On Display: Enable the Always On Display screen. Learn more: Always On Display
 - Now bar: Customize the card to show what you want on the Lock screen.
 - Touch and hold to edit: Choose whether to allow items on the Lock screen to be edited by touching and holding them.
 - Roaming clock: Show the time both where you are and at home while you are roaming.
 - Contact information: Display information such as your phone number or email address on the Lock screen in case you lose your device.
 - Show unlock transition effect: Show a transition effect when you use biometrics to unlock your device.
 - About Lock screen: Update the Lock screen's software.

Biometric security

Use biometrics to securely unlock your device and log in to accounts.

Face recognition

You can enable Face Recognition to unlock your screen. To use your face to unlock your device, you must set a pattern, PIN, or password.

- Face recognition is less secure than Pattern, PIN, or Password. Your device could be unlocked by someone or something that looks like your image.
- · Some conditions may affect face recognition, including wearing glasses, hats, beards, or heavy make-up.
- · When registering your face, ensure that you are in a well-lit area and the camera lens is clean.
- From Settings, tap Security and privacy > Screen lock and biometrics > Face recognition.
- 2. Follow the prompts to register your face.

Face recognition management

Customize how face recognition works.

- From Settings, tap Security and privacy > Screen lock and biometrics >
 Face recognition.
 - Remove face data: Delete existing faces.
 - Add alternative appearance to enhance recognition: Enhance face recognition by adding an alternative appearance.
 - Face unlock: Enable or disable face recognition security.
 - Stay on Lock screen until swipe: When you unlock your device with face recognition, stay on the Lock screen until you swipe the screen.
 - Require open eyes: Facial recognition will only recognize your face when your eyes are open.

Settings

- **Brighten screen**: Increase the screen brightness temporarily so that your face can be recognized in dark conditions.
- **About face recognition**: Learn additional information about securing your device with face recognition.

Fingerprint scanner

Use fingerprint recognition as an alternative to entering passwords in certain apps. You can also use your fingerprint to verify your identity when logging in to your Samsung account. To use your fingerprint to unlock your device, you must set a pattern, PIN, or password.

- From Settings, tap Security and privacy > Screen lock and biometrics > Fingerprints.
- 2. Follow the prompts to register your fingerprint.

Fingerprint management

Add, delete, and rename fingerprints.

- From Settings, tap Security and privacy > Screen lock and biometrics > Fingerprints for the following options:
 - The list of registered fingerprints is at the top of this list. You can tap a fingerprint to remove or rename it.
 - Add fingerprint: Follow the prompts to register another fingerprint.
 - Check added fingerprints: Scan your fingerprint to check if it has been registered.

Fingerprint verification settings

Use fingerprint recognition to verify your identity in supported apps and actions.

- From Settings, tap Security and privacy > Screen lock and biometrics > Fingerprints.
 - Fingerprint unlock: Use your fingerprint for identification when unlocking your device.
 - Fingerprint always on: Scan your fingerprint even when the screen is off.
 - Show icon when screen is off: Show the fingerprint icon when the screen is off.
 - Show animation when unlocking: Show an animation when you use fingerprint verification.
 - **About fingerprints**: Learn additional information about securing your device with fingerprints.

Biometrics settings

Configure your preferences for biometric security options.

- From Settings, tap Security and privacy > Screen lock and biometrics for the following:
 - About unlocking with biometrics: Learn additional information about securing your device with biometrics.

Account security

Sign in to your Samsung and Google accounts to keep your phone secure.

- From Settings, tap Security and privacy > Account security.
- 2. Tap either **Samsung account security** or **Google Account security** to sign in to your account.

Lost device protection

You can protect your device from loss or theft by allowing your device to be locked, tracked online, and for your data to be deleted remotely. A Samsung account is required, and Google location service must be turned on in order to use Find My Mobile.

Turn on Find My Mobile

Before you can use the Find My Mobile feature, you must turn it on and customize the options. You can locate or unlock your device at **smartthingsfind.samsung.com**

- 1. From Settings, tap O Security and privacy > Lost device protection.
- 2. Tap **Find My Mobile** and log in to your Samsung account. The following options are available:
 - Allow this phone to be found: Enable to permit this feature to find this device.
 - Send last location: Allow your device to send its last location to the Find My Mobile server when the remaining battery charge falls below a certain level.

Theft protection

You can enable security features to protect your device if it is stolen.

- 1. From Settings, tap O Security and privacy > Lost device protection.
- 2. Tap **Theft protection** to configure the following options:
 - Identity check: Require biometric checks and enable a security delay when changing sensitive settings on your device.

Google Play Protect

You can configure Google Play to regularly check your apps and device for security risks and threats.

- From Settings, tap Security and privacy > App security > Google Play Protect.
 - · Updates are checked for automatically.

Security update

You can check the date of the last installed security software update and find out if newer updates are available.

From Settings, tap Security and privacy > Updates > Security update to check if an update is available.

Auto blocker

Keep your device safe by blocking threats and other suspicious activity.

- 1. From Settings, tap O Security and privacy > Auto blocker.
- 2. Tap not turn on the feature and configure advanced settings.

Security status of your devices

Check the security status of all devices signed in to your Samsung account using the Knox Matrix.

- 1. From Settings, tap O Security and privacy > Security status of your devices.
- 2. Sign in to your Samsung account to view your devices.

More security settings

Configure additional security settings to better protect your device. Options may vary by service provider.

- From Settings, tap Security and privacy > More security settings for the following options:
 - SIM card security: Set a PIN to lock your SIM card, preventing unauthorized use of your SIM card if someone attempts to use it in another device.
 - Block USB connections while locked: Only allow USB devices to connect if your phone is unlocked.
 - Secure Folder: Create a secure folder on your device to protect private content and apps from anyone who may be using your device. You must sign in to your Samsung account to set up and use Secure folder.
 - Enhanced data protection: Sign in to your Samsung account and enable additional security settings to better protect your data.
 - Allow apps to be pinned: Save an app on your device screen, which prevents access to other features of your device.
 - Passwords, passkeys, and autofill: Save time entering information using autofill services.
 - Make passwords visible: Have characters displayed briefly in password fields as you type them.

- Install unknown apps: Allow installation of unknown third-party apps from selected apps or sources.
- Device admin apps: Authorize security features and apps to have administrative access to your device.
- Trust agents: Allow trusted devices to perform selected actions when connected.
- **Credential storage**: Manage the trusted security certificates installed on your device, which verify the identity of servers for secure connections.
- Android Safe Browsing: Get alerts about threats from dangerous websites.
- Galaxy system app update: Configure your device to receive and install Samsung updates automatically.

Permissions used in the last 24 hours

Review a list of apps and permissions used in the last 24 hours or seven days.

- 1. From Settings, tap O Security and privacy > Permissions used in last 24 hours.
- 2. Tap Permissions or Apps to review usage.

Internet privacy protection

Apps might access features of your device that you permit them to (like the camera, microphone, or location) when they are running in the background, not only when you are using the app. Options may vary by service provider. You can set your device to notify you when this happens.

- 1. From Settings, tap O Security and privacy > Internet privacy protection to open the Privacy dashboard.
- 2. Tap an option to customize settings:
 - Trackers blocked: Graph of trackers that have been blocked over time.
 - Smart anti-tracking: Customize when to prevent websites from accessing your browsing history, automatic CAPTCHAs, and a list of trackers that have been blocked.
 - You're protected from interruptions: Enable options to block backward redirections, pop-ups, and apps that open the Internet.

- Block automatic downloads: Help prevent malicious downloads that could cause problems on your device.
- Switch to secure connection (HTTPS): Automatically redirect from unencrypted websites to the encrypted version if supported.
- Reset privacy settings: Undo all changes made to privacy settings.



NOTE When using an app or service for the first time that wants to access certain features of your device, a dialog box asks if you want to permit such access.

Controls and alerts

Control app access to the camera, microphone, and clipboard.

- 1. From Settings, tap O Security and privacy > Controls and alerts.
- 2. Tap an option to enable or disable:
 - Microphone access: Allow apps to use the microphone if they have the appropriate permissions.
 - Alert when clipboard accessed: Get an alert when an app accesses content copied to the clipboard.

Samsung Privacy

Send diagnostic information about your device to Samsung when you are having technical problems.

- 1. From Settings, tap Security and privacy > More privacy settings.
- 2. Under **Samsung** tap privacy services to customize them.

Google Privacy


Customize Android and Google privacy features.

- From Settings, tap Security and privacy > More privacy settings.
- 2. Under Google tap privacy services to customize them.

Location

Location services use a combination of GPS, mobile network, and Wi-Fi to determine the location of your device.

- 1. From Settings, tap O Location.
- 2. Tap to turn on Location services.



TIP Some apps require location services be turned on to function.

App permissions

Configure permissions for apps that want to access your location information.

- 1. From Settings, tap O Location > App permissions.
- 2. Tap an app and choose which location permissions to grant it. Options vary by app.

Location services

Location services store and use your device's most recent location data. Certain apps can use this data to improve your search results based on places that you have visited.

- 1. From Settings, tap O Location > Location services.
- 2. Tap an entry to check how your location information is used.
- 3. Tap a connection method under **Improve accuracy** to add or remove from location services:
 - Wi-Fi scanning: Allow apps and services to scan for Wi-Fi networks automatically, even when Wi-Fi is turned off.
 - Bluetooth scanning: Allow apps to scan for and connect to nearby devices automatically through Bluetooth, even when Bluetooth is turned off.

Recent access

Display a list of apps that have requested your location.

- 1. From Settings, tap O Location.
- 2. Tap to turn on Location services.
- 3. Tap an entry under Recent access for the app's settings.

Safety and emergency

Configure and enable safety features that can help you in an emergency.

Medical info

Emergency responders and others can access your medical info even when your device is locked.

- 1. From Settings, tap 📵 **Safety and emergency > Medical info.**
- 2. Enter your allergies, current medication, and other medical information you would like to be available in an emergency.
- 3. Tap **Save**.

Emergency contacts

Emergency contacts can be called even when your device is locked.

- From Settings, tap Safety and emergency > Emergency contacts.
 - 911: By default 911 is the first emergency service listed.
 - Add emergency contact: Choose contacts on your phone as your emergency contacts.
 - Show on Lock screen: Show emergency contacts on the Lock screen for quick access in an emergency.
 - Share during emergency calls and texts: Send your emergency contacts and medical information to the emergency services you call or text.

Emergency messaging

Send a message with pictures and audio to your emergency contacts.

- From Settings, tap Safety and emergency > Emergency SOS. Enable to start the following actions by pressing Side button five times:
 - Require swipe to call: Enable to require swiping the Call button in addition to pressing Side button five times to dial your emergency number.
 - Emergency number to call: Choose the number to dial for an emergency call.
 - Send SOS to emergency contacts: Enable to send your location to your emergency contacts.



TIP You can also activate Emergency SOS by pressing Side button and Volume down button, and then tapping 💟 Emergency call.

Emergency satellite messaging

Message emergency services and share your location using satellite communication. When you connect with emergency services by satellite, your name, email, phone number, location, device information, and emergency contact information are shared with emergency services and satellite service providers.



NOTE To use Satellite SOS, Google Messages must be your default SMS app.

- From Settings, tap Safety and emergency > Satellite SOS. Configure the following information to send to emergency services:
 - Emergency contacts: Add contacts that you want emergency services to get in touch with.
 - Google Account info: Add personal information that you want emergency services to have.

Emergency sharing

Send a message with pictures and audio to your emergency contacts.

- From Settings, tap Safety and emergency > Emergency sharing. Choose what to send to your emergency contacts if you need help:
 - Emergency contacts: Add contacts you trust to help you in an emergency.
 - Attach pictures: Take and send pictures from your front and rear cameras.
 - Attach audio recording: Record and send five seconds of audio.
- 2. Tap **Start emergency sharing** to send your selected media to your emergency contacts.

Emergency Location Service

If Emergency Location Service (ELS) is supported in your region, when you call or text an emergency number, your device can automatically send its location to emergency response partners.

- From Settings, tap Safety and emergency > Emergency Location Service.
- 2. Tap () to turn on Emergency Location Service.

Emergency alerts

Emergency alerts notify you of imminent threats and other situations. There is no charge for receiving an Emergency alert.

 From Settings, tap Safety and emergency > Wireless Emergency Alerts to customize notifications for emergency alerts.



TIP You can also access Emergency alerts in Notifications. From Settings, tap

Notifications > Advanced settings > Wireless Emergency Alerts.

Earthquake alerts

Receive alerts when an earthquake is detected nearby. This feature is not available in all areas.

From Settings, tap Safety and emergency > Earthquake alerts.

Unknown tracker alerts

Receive alerts when an unknown tracker is detected traveling with you. Alerts are deleted after 48 hours.

- From Settings, tap **Safety and emergency > Unknown tracker alert**, and tap to enable.
 - Tap Scan now to do a manual scan for unknown trackers.

Accounts

You can connect to and manage your accounts, including your Google Account, Samsung account, email, and social networking accounts.

Add an account | Account settings | Remove an account | Backup and restore | Google settings

Add an account

You can add and sync all your email, social networking, and picture and video sharing accounts.

- From Settings, tap Accounts and backup > Manage accounts > + Add account.
- 2. Tap one of the account types.
- 3. Follow the prompts to enter your credentials and set up the account.
 - Tap Auto sync data to enable automatic updates to your accounts.

Account settings

Each account has its own custom settings. You can configure common settings for all accounts of the same type. Account settings and available features vary between account types.

- 1. From Settings, tap 😉 Accounts and backup > Manage accounts.
- 2. Tap an account to customize its settings.

Remove an account

You can remove accounts from your device.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🕢 Accounts and backup > Manage accounts.
- 2. Tap the account and then tap Remove account.

Backup and restore

You can configure your device to back up data to your personal accounts.

Samsung account

You can enable backup of your information to your Samsung account. Options may vary by service provider.

- From Settings, tap Accounts and backup and tap an option under Samsung
 Cloud:
 - Back up data: Configure your Samsung account to back up your data.
 - Restore data: Use your Samsung account to restore your backup data.

Google Account

You can enable backup of your information to your Google Account.

- 1. From Settings, tap 🕢 Accounts and backup.
- 2. Under Google Drive, tap Back up data.

External storage transfer

You can back up your data to a USB storage device, or restore backup data using Smart Switch. Learn more: Transfer data for device setup

From Settings, tap Accounts and backup > External storage transfer.

Google settings

You can configure your device's Google settings. Available options depend on your Google Account.

From Settings, tap G Google, and select an option to customize.

Device maintenance

Check the status of your device's battery, storage, and memory. You can also automatically optimize your device's system resources.

Quick optimization | Battery | Storage | Memory | Advanced device care options | Language and input | Keyboard list and default | Physical keyboards | Mouse and trackpad | Troubleshooting | Customization service

Quick optimization

The quick optimization feature improves device performance through the following actions:

- · Identifying apps that use excessive battery power and clearing unneeded items.
- · Deleting unnecessary files and closing apps running in the background.
- · Scanning for malware.

To use the quick optimization feature:

From Settings, tap ① Device care > Optimize now.

Battery

Review how battery power is used for your various device activities.

- From Settings, tap Device care > Battery for the following options:
 - Power saving: Save battery life by limiting background network usage, syncing, and location checking. Choose from additional power saving options to save more power when this mode is enabled.
 - Background usage limits: Identify apps that you don't use often and limit their battery usage. To disable this feature, tap Put unused apps to sleep.
 - Battery protection: Choose a method to extend the lifespan of your battery.
 - Today: Review your recent battery usage by time, app, and service.
 - Charging settings: Customize the charging settings for your device.
 - Wireless power sharing: Enable wireless charging of supported devices with your device's battery.

- Auto dim screen: Dim the screen when battery is below 5%.
- Show battery percentage: Display the battery charge percentage next to the battery icon on the Status bar.
- Battery information: Display the battery status and level.

Storage

Review your storage capacity and detailed usage by category and file type.

- From Settings, tap Device care > Storage.
 - · Tap a category to manage files.

Memory

Check the amount of available memory. You can close background apps and reduce the amount of memory you are using to speed up your device.

- From Settings, tap ① Device care > Memory. The used and available memory are shown.
 - Tap Clean now to free up as much memory as possible.
 - Tap View more for the full list of apps and services using memory. Tap
 to include or exclude these apps and services.
 - Memory resident apps: Display any apps that run continuously in memory.
 - Tap Excluded apps for a list of apps that have been excluded. Tap
 — Add apps to choose apps to exclude from memory usage
 checks.
 - Tap **RAM Plus** to select how much internal storage to use as virtual memory to improve app performance.

Advanced device care options

Other Device care features are available in the Advanced menu. Options may vary by service provider.

- From Settings, tap ① **Device care**. The following options are available:
 - Q Search: Find panels that are either installed or available to install.
 - | | | Care report: Review information about the restart history and charging and temperature tips.
 - More options > Settings:
 - Show Device care on Apps screen: Display the icon for Device care on the Apps screen.
 - About Device care: Display version and license information about the Device care feature.
 - Contact us: Contact Samsung support through Samsung members.
 - **Auto optimization**: Automatically restart when needed to keep it in the best condition.
 - Software update: Check for software updates.
 - Diagnostics: Review the status of the screen, sensors, charging, and more.
 - Maintenance mode: Turn on Maintenance mode to protect your privacy while someone else is using your device, such as when it is being repaired.

Language and input

Configure your device's language and input settings.

Change the device language

You can add languages to your list and organize them according to preference. If an app does not support your default language, then it will move to the next supported language in your list.

- 1. From Settings, tap 😑 General management > Language.
- 2. Tap Add language, and select a language from the list.
- 3. Tap Set as default to change the device language.
 - To switch to another language on the list, tap the desired language, and then tap Apply.

App languages

Choose which language each app uses by default.

- 1. From Settings, tap 😑 General management > App languages.
- 2. Tap an app to change the default language.

Language packs

Manage and download language packs used for voice input, text-to-speech, and translations.

- 1. From Settings, tap 😑 General management > Language packs.
- 2. Tap a language pack to download or update.

Date and time

By default, your device receives date and time information from the wireless network. Outside of network coverage, you can set the date and time manually.

- From Settings, tap General management > Date and time. The following options are available:
 - Automatic date and time: Receive date and time updates from your wireless network. When Automatic date and time is disabled, the following options are available:
 - **Set date**: Enter the current date.
 - **Set time**: Enter the current time.
 - Automatic time zone: Use the time zone provided by your mobile network. When Automatic time zone is disabled, the following option is available:
 - **Select time zone**: Choose a new time zone.
 - Set time zone based on location: Receive time updates based on your location.
 - Use 24-hour format: Set the format for displaying time.

Keyboard list and default

Change your default keyboard, modify built-in keyboards, and change keyboard settings.

- From Settings, tap General management > Keyboard list and default for the following options:
 - Default keyboard: Choose a default keyboard for your device's menus and keyboards.
 - Samsung keyboard: Modify settings for the Samsung keyboard.
 - · Google voice typing: Modify settings for Google Voice input.
 - **Keyboard button on navigation bar**: Enable a button on the Navigation bar to quickly switch between keyboards.

Physical keyboards

Customize options when you have a physical keyboard connected to your device (sold separately).

- 1. From Settings, tap 😑 General management.
- 2. Tap Physical keyboard, and then choose an option:
 - Show on-screen keyboard: Show the on-screen keyboard while a physical keyboard is also being used.
 - Keyboard shortcuts: Show explanations of the keyboard shortcuts on the screen.
 - Change language shortcut: Enable or disable language key shortcuts for your physical keyboard
 - Customize keys: Configure the Caps lock, Control, Command, and Alt keys.

Mouse and trackpad

Configure pointer speed and button assignments for an optional mouse or trackpad (not included).

- From Settings, tap (=) General management > Mouse and trackpad.
 - Pointer speed: Drag the slider to the right to go faster or to the left to go slower.
 - Wheel scrolling speed: Drag the slider to the right to scroll faster or to the left to scroll slower.
 - Enhance pointer precision: Enable to make the mouse cursor move faster or slower depending on how fast you move your mouse.
 - Pointer size and color: Change the size and color of the mouse pointer.
 - Primary mouse button: Choose either the Left or Right mouse button to be your primary button.
 - Secondary button: Choose the action of your secondary mouse button.
 - Middle button: Choose the action of your middle mouse button.
 - Additional button 1: Choose an action for another available mouse button.
 - Additional button 2: Choose an action for another available mouse button.

Troubleshooting

You can check for software updates and, if necessary, reset services on your device.

Software update/System updates

Check for and install available software updates for your device. Options may vary by service provider.

From Settings, tap Software update/System updates, and then tap an available update option.

Reset

Reset device and network settings. You can also reset your device to its factory defaults.

Backup your data

You can configure your device to back up data to your personal accounts.

- From Settings, tap General management > Reset and tap an option under Back up your data:
 - **Temporary cloud backup**: Back up unlimited data to Samsung Cloud for up to 30 days or restore data you have backed up.
 - External storage backup: Back up your data to an SD card or USB storage device, or restore backup data using Smart Switch.

Reset all settings

You can reset your device to its factory default settings, which resets everything except the security, language, and account settings. Personal data is not affected.

- From Settings, tap General management > Reset > Reset all settings.
- 2. Tap **Reset settings**, and confirm when prompted.

Reset mobile network settings

You can reset mobile data settings with Reset network settings.

- 1. From Settings, tap 😑 General management > Reset > Reset mobile network settings.
- 2. Tap Reset settings, and confirm when prompted.

Reset Wi-Fi and Bluetooth settings

You can reset Wi-Fi and Bluetooth settings.

- 1. From Settings, tap 😑 General management > Reset > Reset Wi-Fi and Bluetooth settings.
- 2. Tap Reset settings, and confirm when prompted.

Reset accessibility settings

You can reset device accessibility settings. Accessibility settings in downloaded apps and your personal data are not affected.

- 1. From Settings, tap 😑 General management > Reset > Reset accessibility settings.
- 2. Tap Reset settings, and confirm when prompted.

Factory Data Reset

You can reset your device to factory defaults, erasing all data from your device.

This action permanently erases ALL data from the device, including Google or other account settings, system and application data and settings, downloaded applications, as well as your music, photos, videos, and other files.

If you sign in to a Google Account on your device and set a Lock screen, Google Device Protection is automatically enabled.



NOTE If you reset your Google Account password, it can take 24 hours for the password reset to sync with all devices registered to the account.

Before resetting your device:

- Verify that the information you want to keep has transferred to your storage area.
- 2. Log in to your Google Account and confirm your user name and password.

To reset your device:

- 1. From Settings, tap 😑 General management > Reset > Factory data reset.
- 2. Tap **Reset** and follow the prompts to perform the reset.
- 3. When the device restarts, follow the prompts to set up your device.

Google Device Protection

When you sign in to a Google Account on your device and set a Lock screen, Google Device Protection is enabled. This service protects your device from unauthorized factory data resets by requiring your Google account information to verify your identity. Learn more: samsung.com/us/support/answer/ANS00083965

Enable Google Device Protection

Adding a Google Account to your device and setting a Lock screen automatically activates Google Device Protection.

Disable Google Device Protection

To disable Google Device Protection, you can either remove all Google Accounts from the device or remove the Lock screen.

To remove Google accounts:

- From Settings, tap Accounts and backup > Manage accounts > [Google Account].
- 2. Tap Remove account.

To remove a secure Lock screen:

- 1. From Settings, tap (1) Lock screen and AOD > Screen lock and biometrics.
- 2. Tap either **Swipe** or **None**.

Customization service

Samsung devices, apps and services are designed to provide you with customized services by predicting your desires and needs in a smart and intelligent manner. Samsung's Customization Service provides an enhanced user experience, including customized content and recommendations, based on the information obtained about you and your use of Samsung's services.

From Settings, tap 😑 General management > Customization service.

There are accessibility settings for people who need help seeing, hearing, or otherwise operating their device. Accessibility services allow you to configure your device to your requirements.
